They observed the activities and behaviour of different wild animals and were thrilled to spot a tiger — the majestic “King” for which Ranthambore is famous. The students also visited the Ranthambore Museum, where they watched a short film based on the story of a famous tigress of Ranthambore. The film deeply touched and inspired them, creating greater awareness and sensitivity towards wildlife conservation. During their stay at the resort, the children had great fun enjoying a lively pool party and an energetic DJ night. The trip became a perfect blend of learning, adventure, bonding, and enjoyment, leaving the students with unforgettable memories.

Examinations not only help in assessing the learning and understanding of students, but also provide valuable insight into the areas where a child may be facing difficulties or needs additional support. The **first Unit Tests** were conducted successfully in a smooth and disciplined manner. Students appeared for the examinations with sincerity and confidence, putting in their best efforts.

A **Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM)** was conducted after the Unit Tests to discuss the academic progress and overall performance of the students. It provided a valuable platform for parents and teachers to interact and

work together for the betterment of the children. Teachers shared feedback regarding the strengths, achievements, and areas that need improvement. Parents appreciated the efforts of the school and actively participated in meaningful discussions. The School Council Elections held on 13th May 2026 were conducted successfully, with enthusiastic participation from students. The event promoted leadership, responsibility, and democratic values, giving students an opportunity to choose their representatives through a fair and transparent voting process. At IHS, we believe that learning is not confined to the four walls of a classroom but extends far beyond them. Keeping this vision in mind, our students actively participated in various interschool events, where they showcased their talents, interacted with peers from different schools, and gained valuable experience. These opportunities helped them develop confidence, teamwork, and a spirit of healthy competition while broadening their horizons. In the series, **Jasmin Kaur** participated in Srijanotsav - II held at Made Easy School on 30 April 2026 in the event Mythology Reimagined: Dramatic Solo Performance. **Kanishka Kalia** participated in the event Verbal Vanguard, held at Raman Munjal Vidya Mandir Literary Fest 2026 on 20 May 2026. She presented her views in favour of the motion and marked her presence. **Archit Patel** participated and qualified for the second round of the event Chrono Rebuild which was a part of the inter-school competition Techtonik 5.0 held at Suncity School, 37 D.

Our students not only excel in academics, but they also mark their presence in sports as well. **Pragyaan Wadhwa** won a silver medal in the inter-school badminton held at Made Easy School, whereas **Shambhavi Wadhwa** won a bronze medal in the yoga competition. **Vidisha Rathore** added yet another feather to her cap and won a silver medal at the 4th National Fitness Ride Championship, Taekwondo 2026, held at Made Easy School on 18th April, 2026. As part of the **Value of the Month – Responsibility**, a short film was shown to highlight the importance of being responsible in everyday life. Through the simple **Game of Jenga**, the film effectively demonstrated how every individual's actions impact others and why responsibility is essential for everyone at all times. The activity encouraged students to reflect on their roles and responsibilities both in school and at home.

SEA ENGLISH - As part of the poem “How to Tell Wild Animals”, the students of Grade X participated in an engaging Two-Minute Debate on the thought-provoking topic: “Who Suffers More in Environmental Conflict – Humans or Nature?” The activity encouraged students to critically analyse the relationship between humans and the environment while expressing their opinions with confidence and clarity.

SEA CHEMISTRY- The activity on the properties of acids and bases and determination of pH of various solutions was demonstrated to the students. Through practical experiments, students observed colour changes using indicators and understood the acidic and basic nature of different substances. The activity helped them connect theoretical concepts with practical learning while improving their observational and analytical skills.

SEA BIOLOGY - Students actively explored the structural features of stomata by preparing temporary slides and observing them under a microscope. Through this hands-on activity, they identified guard cells and stomatal pores, strengthening their understanding of stomatal structure and function. Students also performed an experiment to demonstrate that carbon dioxide is released during respiration. These practical activities enhanced their scientific observation and experimental skills while helping them reinforce and recapitulate key concepts from the chapter *Life Processes*.

IHS NEWS: Our Grade X and XII results are out, and we are delighted to share that our students have successfully passed with excellent performances.
