Welcome to a New Beginning!

Environment Week Celebrations: During Environment Week, students actively participated in various activities that promoted eco-consciousness. Earth Day was observed with a thoughtful class discussion highlighting the importance of our planet. Students participated in creative and eco-friendly activities. They made 3D paper plate

crafts, contributed to E-waste recycling by bringing old batteries and wires, and created leafy letter crafts using natural leaves. The activities spread awareness about caring for the environment. As part of the week-long celebrations, students enthusiastically participated in a range of activities that reinforced the importance of caring for the environment. Through the **“Each One Plant One”** initiative, they planted saplings and learned how small acts of responsibility can contribute to a greener future. The **Earth Day Inter-Class Poem Recitation Competition** provided a platform for students to creatively share their thoughts and concerns about the planet.

The celebrations culminated in a special assembly presented by the senior students, who spread awareness about environmental conservation through thought-provoking performances and presentations. Addressing the students, the Principal encouraged everyone to make environmentally conscious choices in their daily lives and emphasized that collective efforts, however small, can help create a more sustainable world.

World English Day Celebration- To celebrate World English Day, students took part in a fun and interactive listening activity. They carefully listened to the instructions given by their partner and completed the task without seeing it. The activity helped improve their listening, communication, and understanding skills while making learning enjoyable.

World Dance Day- On World Dance Day, students enthusiastically participated in dance performances and showcased their talent and energy. The celebration filled the atmosphere with joy, rhythm, and excitement while encouraging students to express themselves through dance.

It was a simple yet meaningful way to express their heartfelt gratitude towards their mothers.

Value of the Month “Responsibility” : Students learned the importance of being responsible through meaningful class discussions. They created responsibility charts for both school and home to practice good habits daily. Students also connected this value with nature by taking care of their saplings and watering them regularly, showing responsibility towards the environment.

In **English**, students revised words and sentences through a colourful Rainbow activity. They learned about Common and Proper Nouns by identifying classroom objects and creating a flower garden activity in their notebooks. Students also explored singular and plural forms and punctuation through fun activities and an interactive PPT. For the Coursebook they learnt about the chapter **“Under My Bed”** and the poem **The Rainbow**.

In **Math**, students learned numbers, place value, and face value through the “Apple Tree Place Value” activity using H, T, O apples and expanded forms. Addition was introduced through a fun shopping story, and both topics were taught using an interactive PPT followed by notebook tasks.

In **EVS**, children learned about “My Family” through a house poster activity where they pasted pictures of their family members, while “My Neighbourhood” was taught through an interactive PPT. “My Wonderful Body” was explored through a sensory game using touch, smell, taste, and hearing senses. “Plants Around Us” was introduced through a nature walk, plant structure puzzle activity, and leaf printing in notebooks. “Our Food” was taught through an interactive PPT using picture cards, along with discussions on healthy eating and avoiding junk food, followed by a food pyramid activity in notebooks.

The **General Assembly** was conducted by Grade II A on the topic Courage. Students shared their thoughts confidently and participated enthusiastically in the activities. The quiz session made the assembly interactive and enjoyable, and the children had great fun while learning the importance of courage.

Bagless Day – In the months of April and May, the school observed Bagless Days where students came to school without books and participated in fun and interactive classroom activities.
