Welcome Assembly by Teachers: The new academic session was inaugurated with a gracious and uplifting welcome assembly organised by the teachers, fostering a sense of positivity, enthusiasm, and readiness among the students for the year ahead.

Cyber Safety Workshop: Students attended an enlightening Cyber Safety Workshop centred on digital security, emerging cyber threats, and appropriate mechanisms for reporting cyber offences. The session sensitised students to the significance of ethical online conduct, protection of personal data, and the need to remain cautious and responsible while navigating the digital world.

Parent Orientation: The Parent Orientation Programme acquainted parents with the CBSE reforms aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP), including initiatives such as Kaushal Bodh, Computational Thinking, and Artificial Intelligence. The session highlighted the significance of skill-oriented and experiential learning, continuous internal assessment, and the holistic development of learners. Parents were encouraged to actively support their child's participation, nurture inquisitiveness and creativity, and remain informed about academic progress and school updates through the ERP platform.

Jallianwala Bagh Massacre: The students of IHS paid heartfelt tribute to the martyrs of the **Jallianwala Bagh Massacre**, which occurred on April 13th, 1919, in Amritsar. Commemorating 106 years since this tragic event—widely regarded as a turning point in Indian history—students participated in a range of meaningful activities. Grade VII students actively took part in a Report making activity on the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre, remembered as one of the darkest chapters in Indian history.

Olympiad certification: Students were also felicitated for wonderful achievements in the Olympiad examinations. **Parakh Rajput**, VII B, won a Gold Medal in IMO and **Rehaan Verma**, VII B, won Gold Medals in IMO and NSO for their excellence in the pursuit of knowledge.

World Heritage Day: On April 17th, students participated enthusiastically in the celebration of World Heritage Day, also recognised as the International Day for Monuments and Sites. The occasion aimed to highlight the significance of cultural heritage and create awareness about the preservation and protection of

historical monuments and sites across the world. To commemorate the day, students engaged in a creative and informative activity based on the valour, culture, and architectural legacy of the Rajputs, which enhanced their appreciation of India's rich historical heritage.

Environment week: At IHS, we are dedicated to fostering both individual and collective responsibility among students, inspiring them to contribute actively towards the preservation of our environment. Beyond academic excellence, we strive to cultivate environmental consciousness and instill in young learners a profound understanding of sustainable living and conservation practices. Our aim is to empower students to envision a greener future and participate meaningfully in eco-friendly initiatives, thereby shaping them into responsible global citizens capable of bringing about positive change in society.

In pursuit of this vision, the school organised an "Environment Week" filled with engaging and thought-provoking activities. Students participated enthusiastically in a **Plantation Drive**, an **Inter-Class Quiz Competition**, a **Mini Biodiversity Journal activity**, and various Inter-House Competitions. A Special Assembly conducted by the students further highlighted the importance of environmental conservation and reinforced the need to protect and preserve our natural resources.

- **Mini Biodiversity Journal:** Students designed a "Mini Biodiversity Journal" in which they recorded and illustrated different plant species, animals, and natural components observed in their surroundings. The activity strengthened their analytical and investigative abilities while deepening their understanding of biodiversity and the significance of environmental preservation.

- **World English Day - Word Warriors** - The class was divided into four groups based on elements of nature: fire, earth, water and air. The groups were given a time limit under which they had to come up with a comprehensive vocabulary pertaining to that specific group. Students were energetic as they wrote the word list and brainstormed to write as many words as fast as possible!

- **Water Warriors: Save the Water Audit:** As part of the "Water Warriors: Save the Water Audit" initiative, students carefully monitored and analysed everyday water consumption patterns. They identified instances of unnecessary wastage and proposed effective conservation measures, thereby promoting awareness about judicious water usage and nurturing a sense of responsibility towards safeguarding this invaluable natural resource.

- **Intra-Class Quiz Competition:** Students participated with great enthusiasm in the Intra-Class Quiz Competition organised during Environment Week. The competition assessed their awareness of environmental concerns, sustainable practices, and conservation strategies, while simultaneously encouraging collaborative learning, critical thinking, and a healthy competitive spirit among participants.

Value of the Month: The value theme for the months of April and May was "Responsibility." Subject enrichment activities:

- **Mathematics:** Numbers Tell the Story: A Decade of Growth- Tracing the heartbeat of India's busiest metros, this activity transformed cold census data from 2001 and 2011 into a vivid lesson on Large Numbers. By comparing the massive population shifts in cities like Mumbai and Bengaluru, students moved beyond the textbook to master 8 and 9-digit figures in a real-world context. Mastering the dance of commas and the precision of number names became second nature as they calculated the millions of new residents added over ten years. This journey through demographic data proved that mathematics is the ultimate tool for measuring the pulse of a growing nation, turning abstract place values into a clear picture of urban evolution

- **Science:** Students practically explored the differences between compounds and mixtures through an activity using iron filings and sulphur, where the magnetic properties of iron helped them distinguish between the two. They also identified and understood the various components of an electric circuit and learnt their functions through hands-on activities. Further, students gained practical knowledge about the working and functioning of an electric torch by observing its circuit arrangement and operation.

Class party: Students thoroughly enjoyed a cheerful class party organized before they parted for the summer break. The celebration was filled with laughter, games, music, and treats, creating a joyful and memorable conclusion to the academic session.

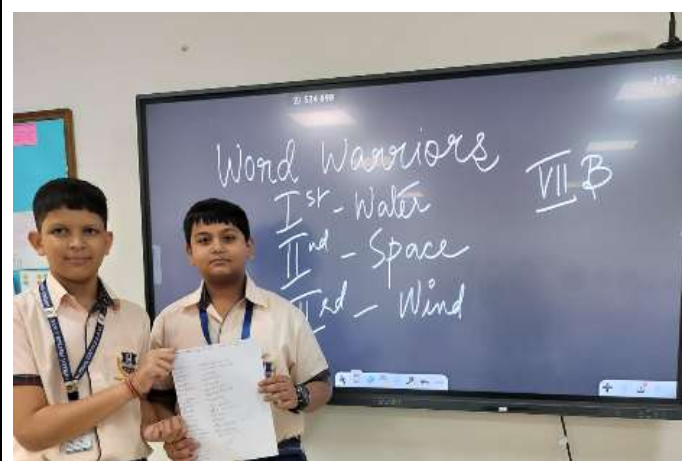

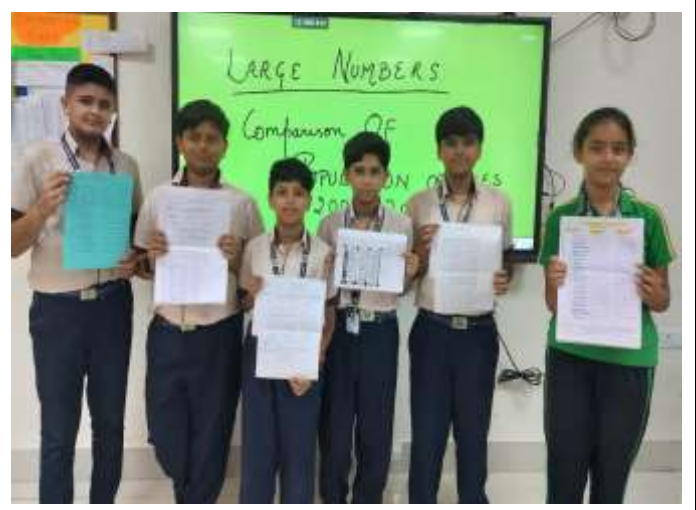
