The first school assembly of the new session was a delightful and memorable experience, led entirely by the teachers to warmly welcome the students. As the music began, the atmosphere came alive with beautiful classical and western dance performances that filled the stage with grace and joy. The teachers also sang cheerful and inspiring songs, spreading positivity and excitement throughout the assembly while conveying a heartfelt message of support and encouragement to every child. The highlight of the morning was the warm and inspiring address by our respected Principal Ma'am, who welcomed the students with her encouraging words and motivated them to begin the year with confidence, curiosity, and kindness. She reminded everyone that school is a place to learn, grow, and create beautiful memories together. To make the welcome even more special, teachers presented students with lovely handmade crafts such as pencil crafts, funny clowns, and flower bouquets, making the start of the new academic session truly joyful and memorable.

A **Parent Orientation Programme** was organised for existing parents to familiarise them with the school's rules, regulations, and overall functioning. The session aimed to strengthen the partnership between the school and parents by clearly communicating expectations and procedures. During the orientation, important updates regarding newly introduced school policies were discussed in detail. Additionally, the latest guidelines and policies introduced by CBSE were also shared to keep parents well-informed. An interactive question-and-answer session allowed parents to clarify their doubts and gain better understanding. The programme was informative and helped in building a strong and supportive school-parent relationship.

The little ones joyfully celebrated **Baisakhi** by creating beautiful 3D Pankha crafts. They used sponge printing to decorate the base of the Pankha and added sparkle and creativity with mirrors and glitter sheet cutouts. The activity was full of fun and excitement, allowing the children to explore their artistic skills while learning about the festive spirit of Baisakhi. To mark the occasion, a special Baisakhi assembly was presented by the senior students, highlighting the significance of the harvest festival through vibrant performances and informative presentations. The Principal addressed the students and spoke about the values of gratitude, hard work, and togetherness associated with Baisakhi. The celebrations filled the school with joy and enthusiasm, making the learning experience both meaningful and memorable.

Green, the colour of growth, freshness, and prosperity, was celebrated as the **Colour of the Month** with great enthusiasm. The little learners enjoyed making creative 3D Frog craft using colourful paper cutouts and also participated in a concentration activity where they carefully segregated and separated curry leaves. They further enhanced their creativity by pasting tree cutouts on paper, making the activities both fun and educational. Dressed beautifully in green outfits, the children explored and observed various green-coloured objects around them, helping them learn and recognize the concept of the green colour in an enjoyable way.

Environment Week was celebrated with great enthusiasm through many fun and meaningful activities. The students created beautiful “Tiny Hands, Big Earth” crafts by crumbling tissue paper and painting it with green colour, and also made “Growing Green Earth” crafts by pasting tissue paper on cardboard and painting it in vibrant green and blue shades. As part of the celebration, the children also planted small plants to spread more greenery and understand the importance of caring for nature. Through these creative craft and planting activities, the students learned about the beauty of our planet and the importance of protecting the environment, making the celebration both enjoyable and educational. The week also featured a special assembly presented by senior students, who shared inspiring messages, thought-provoking presentations, and ideas on environmental conservation. Addressing the students, the Principal emphasized the importance of adopting eco-friendly habits and encouraged them to become responsible citizens who care for and protect the planet for future generations.

The theme for the month was “**All About Me.**” The students learned about different body parts and created a 3D “My Face Emotions” craft on glass, expressing various feelings in a creative way. They also explored the five sense organs using different objects, helping them understand how we see, hear, smell, taste, and touch in our daily lives. As part of a hygiene activity, the children played in a sand tray and then washed their hands with water, which helped them learn the importance of maintaining hand hygiene and keeping themselves clean.

On the **academic** front, the students learned the letters L and I, numbers 1 and 2, and the shape of a circle through fun and engaging activities like tracing, coloring, and games. To learn about the circle, they pasted small circles inside a big circle, which helped them understand the shape better. They also played the game ‘Ringa Ringa Roses’ by holding hands and making a big circle. They explored the concept of Big and Small by sorting different objects according to their size. Using toys, blocks, and daily items, they could clearly see the difference between big and small. These hands-on activities made learning easy, enjoyable, and meaningful for the little ones.

Mother’s Day was a very happy and special day for the little children. They made a small, beautiful flower bouquet with colorful flowers for their mothers and expressed their love and gratitude in a creative way. They also performed a joyful dance full of love, especially dedicated to their mothers

The value for the months of April and May was Responsibility. During these months, students learned the importance of taking care of their own belongings by keeping their things neat, organised, and returning them to the proper place after use. They also understood that responsibility means completing tasks independently and showing that they can be trusted. Students learned the importance of caring for and respecting their elders by helping them in small ways, such as offering water or assisting with simple tasks, and understood that these acts are also a part of being responsible.

Bagless Day was the most exciting day for our little learners. They enjoyed various subject concept-related activities with great enthusiasm and fun. For literacy, the children revised the letter L by jumping on the letter and identifying related objects. In numeracy, they enjoyed driving a toy car on the cut-out of number 1 to strengthen number recognition. They also enjoyed a black paper activity for hygiene awareness and practised different patterns by moving around the table with crayons, creating multiple beautiful patterns on white chart paper. It was a joyful day filled with learning, creativity, and excitement.

The final day before the summer vacation was filled with fun, joy, and excitement. Students enjoyed sorting balloons marked with the letters **L** and **I** from a mix of different letter balloons. They also had great fun searching for the numbers **1** and **2** and matching them with the given colours. The children expressed their creativity by making different emotions on the sand tray. Adding to the excitement, they spent time watching an entertaining movie and playing enjoyable games with their friends. The cheerful celebrations brought the school term to a happy close and left everyone eagerly looking forward to the summer holidays.

Parent focus: Some themes that could be emphasized at this stage of development are outlined- Teaching correct anatomical names for body parts; the swimsuit rule; teaching children that their body belongs to them and no secret touching is acceptable from any adult.
