In Mathematics, they enjoyed exploring shapes and problem-solving skills by making colourful Tangram puzzle and fun games involving counting dominos, picking round objects, and placing balls into hoopla rings. In EVS, students explored engaging experiments like a tornado-in-a-jar and learned about the digestive system through simple demonstrations, along with balancing games that enhanced their coordination. In Hindi, they enjoyed the swar activity. The day was a joyful blend of creativity, movement, and learning, making it both meaningful and memorable.

In academics, students began learning cursive writing by practicing basic strokes and explored concepts like after, before, between, more, and less through interactive activities. They were also introduced to the five sense organs- eyes, ears, nose, tongue, and skin and enthusiastically contributed their existing knowledge. IHS News

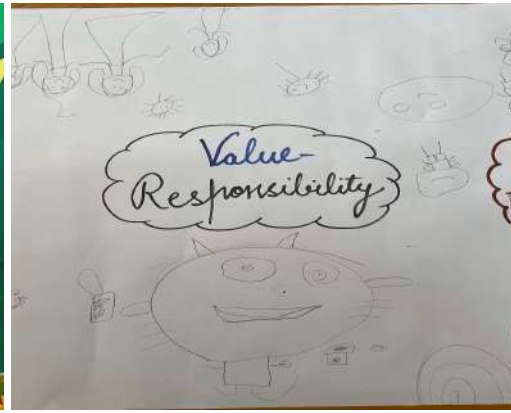
