In **Physics**, a **Prism experiment** was done in the Physics laboratory to make the students more clear about the concept of refraction of light through glass prism.

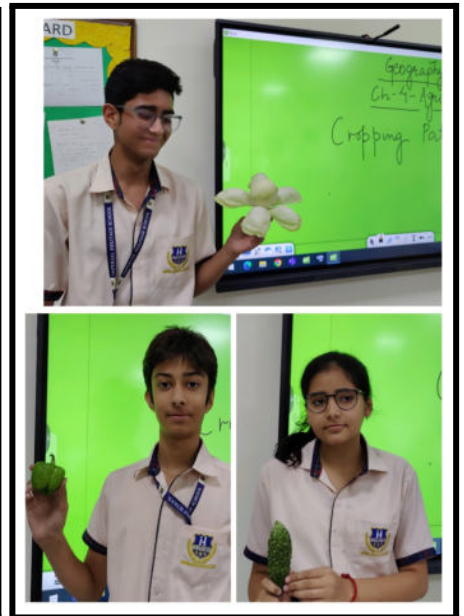
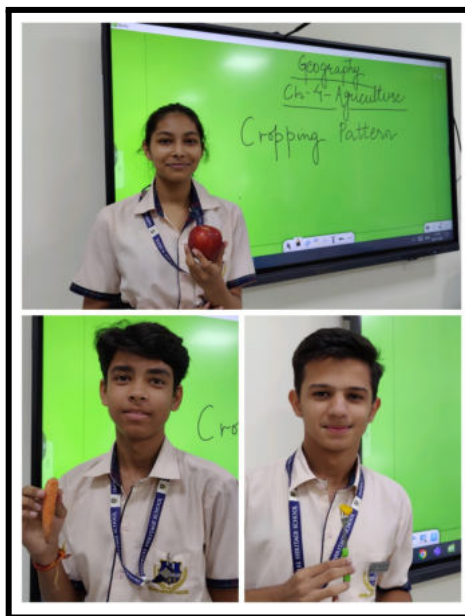
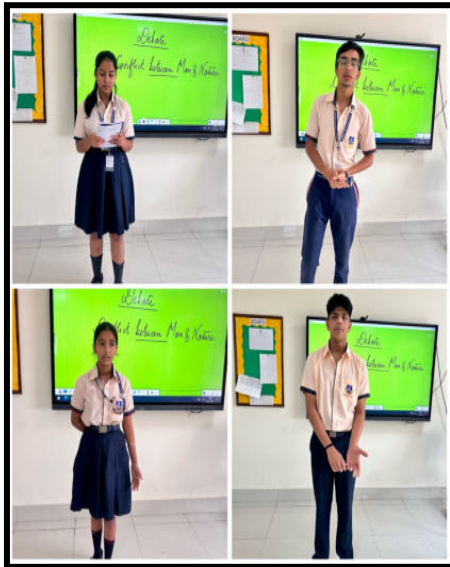
In **Chemistry**, a Practical was conducted to observe the action of Zn, Fe,Cu and Al metals on different salt solutions.

## 3. General Information
