In July, team IHS focused on reconnecting and assessing the students. Maintaining an outstanding balance between academics and co-curricular activities is crucial to a successful educational experience. In consonance with this belief, team IHS planned and executed activities with academics. The value of the month was ‘**Courage.**’ Activities like ‘Naming What Scares You’ and ‘Does it take courage to be a performer?’ were conducted in the class.

**The Proficiency Awards Ceremony, 2022-23** was organized to felicitate the budding talents whose persistent, quest for success, dedication, sincerity, and perseverance led them to surpass excellence. **Jhalak Rana** and **Priyansh Agarwal** were awarded for their scholastic achievements.

A child's reading skills are important to his success in school as it will allow him to access the breadth of the curriculum, and improve his communication and language skills. In consonance with the thought, ‘**Book Week**’ activities were designed for the students. Students participated in ‘The Wall... Famous quotes from Books’ activity and ‘The Masquerade Ball...’ hosted by Romeo and Juliet intraclass competition, wherein **Anupriya Kumari, Yug Joshi and Ranvir Rana** bagged the First, Second and Third positions. ‘**The Life of Shakespeare Poster- Inter house competition**’ was also conducted wherein Champions house got first, Challengers second and Leaders and Warriors got the third position.

A **special assembly** on the theme ‘**Books**’ was presented by Grade VIII students. By the means of Sanskrit Shlokas, Poems, Nukkad Natak and Thoughts students conveyed that they learn a lot of things from books and books take them into a unique world of imagination and improve their standard of living. Our students reached the audience through group song, dance and nukkad natak. Nukkad Natak touched the important aspects of students’ life- like getting distracted by social media, dependence on e-content instead of books. Students also spread the awareness of various schemes run by the government to educate every citizen of India. Efforts made by the students were much appreciated by the Principal Ma’am, Mrs. Neelu Sharma. She reiterated the message- ‘Books deepen, widen, and expand our sense of life. They feed the soul with knowledge.’

To inculcate and encourage the reading habits among the students, ‘**Avid Readers**’ of the previous session were recognised. Tanvi Yadav, Rythm, Navya, Jhalak Rana and Priyansh Agarwal were identified as the insatiable readers.

Students celebrated **National French Day**, which marks the start of the French Revolution, a pivotal moment in French history. The celebration commenced with a brief introduction of the history of France. The students showcased their talents by preparing delicious French cuisines. The activity helped the students

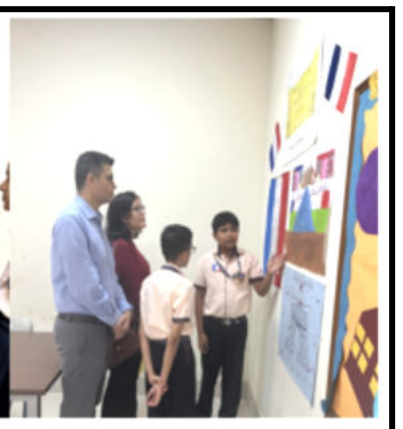
to gain more knowledge about French history and their culture. It was a great learning experience for all the students.

In **Math**, students learnt about some tricks from Vedic Math, such as how they can find the square of a two digit number without actual multiplication, a trick to find the square of a number whose middle number is zero, and a trick to find the square of a number ending with 5.

In **Science**, students learnt and presented the harmful effects of overexposure to Wi-Fi radiation on various organ systems of the body and the measures one can take in order to minimize the exposure to the radiation. Students also experimentally learned the concepts of ignition temperature under the chapter Combustion and Fuel. They also compared various commercially available fuels and made conclusions about the fuel efficiency and ideal properties.

## 3. General Information

In case of illness, a medical certificate must be submitted within three days of rejoining school. In case of long leave to attend important family functions, prior written permission of the Headmistress / Principal must be obtained.
