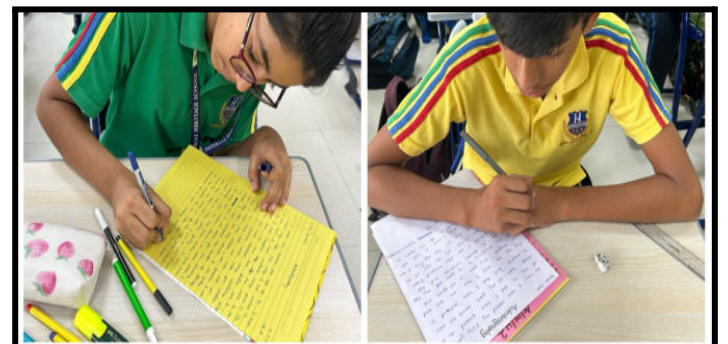
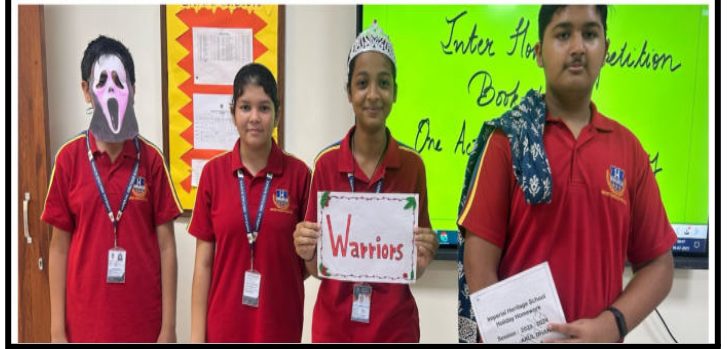
In **Math**, they made different types of angles ( Corresponding angles, Alternate interior, and Exterior angles) on transversal lines by cutting and pasting different colored sheets.
