Students of Grade X demonstrated various yoga asanas as the school conducted a **yoga session.** Warm up exercises were taken and all the students performed sitting and standing asanas and the importance of these were explained simultaneously.



3. General Information

In case of illness, a medical certificate must be submitted within three days of rejoining school.
