Environmental disaster - A Historical overview Activity was carried out on 24th April where students presented an insight into Environmental disasters caused by human interventions through PowerPoint Presentations. Ugly Journey of our Trash Research and Presentation activity was conducted on 25th April wherein the students presented the various types of wastes (Plastic, E-waste, Fertilizers, and Pesticides) disposed of by human beings in the various ecosystems and how they become integral parts of food webs and their harmful effects through Posters.

Intra class debate competition was conducted on 28th April, on 'Plastic- a Boon'. Aman Sharma, Ishant Rekhi, Kreesha Beel, Baani Sidhu, Diya Sahay, Harshita Singh, and Naqi Ali secured First position as a team in the competition. Students were highly enthusiastic about the debate and participated with full zeal.

Symposium on Occupational Hazards was carried out on 28th April which gave the students insight into occupational Hazards. The entire class participated in the symposium.

Yoga guarantees wellness as well as fitness. It is not merely an exercise but a way to attain peace through physical, mental, and spiritual well-being. Therefore, the students and teachers with great enthusiasm learned about various asanas and exercises.

Inter-school competitions were held in Raman Munjal Vidya Mandir and Ambience Public School on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of May in which Baani Sindhu, Hanshika Jindal, Harshita Singh, Saundarya Bhatti, and Kreesha Beel participated and presented a Case Study on the theme 'The Metamorphosis for Sustainability'.

MUN teaches participants skills like research, public speaking, debating, and writing, in addition to critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership. While MUN is typically used as an extracurricular activity, our students-**Diya Sahay**, **Saksham Swami** and **Hanshika Singh** attended the first session of understanding the core of this platform.
