Students also enjoyed colouring and pasting different internal organs on a big body cut out that they had learnt in the chapter – MY BODY.

In English, students recapitulated the concept of Singular and Plural through a fun filled activity where they sorted the plurals according to the change in plural rules. Students also enjoyed doing an activity in their Math session where they demonstrated an understanding of Number bonds through an activity where they made their own number bonds through the use of addition.

3. General Information

- School timing is 8.00 am – 2:30 pm. School gate will be closed at 8.05 am. No entry will be allowed post that.
- Students must carry the almanac to school daily.
- Parents should check the almanac and ERP app regularly for any information.
