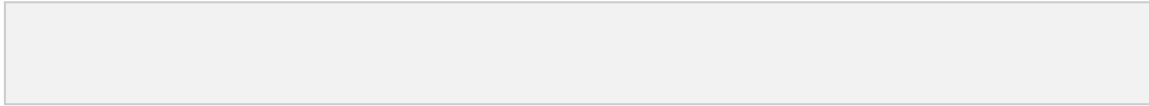

'**World Heritage Day**' was celebrated on 18th April to strengthen the bonds between ethnic and cultural diversity.

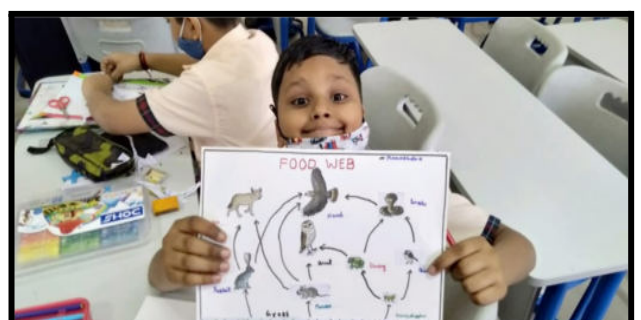
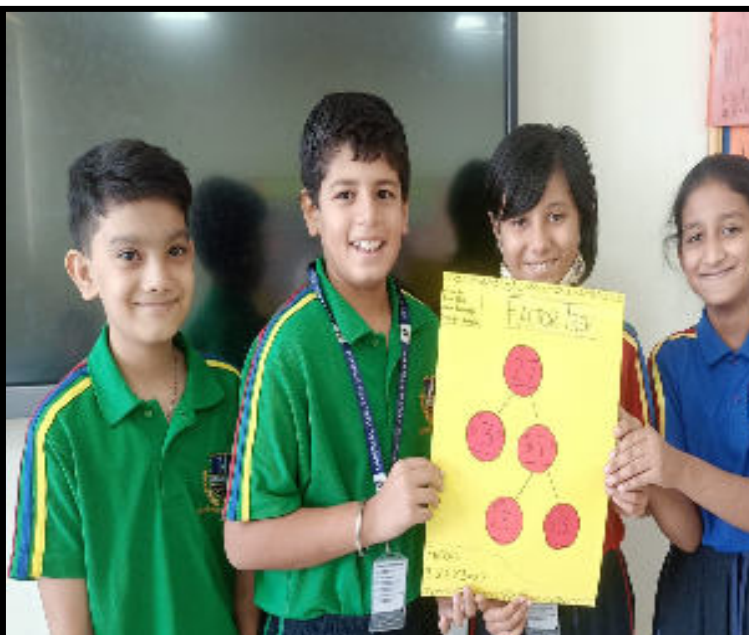

3. General Information
