The first day of school is all about setting expectations, learning about each other, and building culture. First day activity was conducted for the students wherein they introduced themselves by writing an attributive adjective to their names and creating an artwork of the first letter of their name. At the beginning of the new session concept bridging was done in the classes, wherein the students recapitulated the concepts taught in the previous grade by the subject teachers.

**Jallianwala Bagh Massacre Day** is observed every year on April 13. This day is observed as a reminder of one of the darkest days in the struggle for Indian Independence. **Jallianwala Bagh Massacre Day 2023** marks 104 years since the tragic incident that is seen as a turning point in Indian history. Students made a scrapbook on the Black Day of Indian History.

Students were made aware of ‘Wonders of the world’ on the occasion of ‘**World Heritage Day**’, also known as the International Day for Monuments and Sites. They designed a folder cover sketching any one ‘Wonders of the World’.

Students got an opportunity to participate in the **CBSE Expression Series**, which was based on the theme ‘Skill Development in India: From Local to Global’. Students also attempted the first round of **CBSE Science Challenge 2023–24**, conducted on Wednesday, 18th April 23 wherein Anupriya Kumari and Arnab Yadav qualified and attempted the second round. The result of the same is awaited.

An ‘**Environment Week**’ was celebrated from 20th April – 26th April 2023. During this week, students actively participated in an Inter House Quiz Competition, Habitats and Food Webs Activity, and Framing of Nature-Centered Curriculum Intraclass Competition. **Priyansh Agarwal (Challengers) bagged 1<sup>st</sup> position, Ashish Sharan (Champions) bagged 2<sup>nd</sup> position, Dhairya Jindal (Warriors) bagged 3<sup>rd</sup> position in Inter House Quiz Competition. Jhalak Rana, Anupriya and Krishang Gupta secured top three positions in the Framing of Nature-centered Curriculum Intraclass Competition.**

The annual ‘**World Day for Safety and Health**’ at Work on 28th April promotes the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases globally. On this occasion, Grade VIII students made Safety brochures.

**Yoga** is a way of living that aims towards 'a healthy mind in a healthy body'. To create awareness as to how and why yoga streamlines the biomechanics of the human body, a Yoga session was conducted on June 21st.

**Cyber safety** is all about staying safe online and being aware of the potential risks of using the Internet. As the world becomes increasingly digital, it is important to teach children about Cyber safety to help them navigate the online world safely. Cyber attacks are becoming more common, and children are often easy targets due to their lack of experience and knowledge. **‘Cyber workshop’** was organized for the students of **Grades V- XI by renowned Cyber expert, Dr. Rakshit Tandon, Cyber Security Evangelist- Risk Advisory** , Cyber Detect & Respond Leader to discuss the importance of teaching children about cyber security, tips to educate them about cyber security risks and tools to help them learn.

**MUN** teaches participants skills like research, public speaking, debating, and writing, in addition to critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership. Our student attended the first session of understanding the core of this platform. **Yug Joshi, Priyansh Agarwal, Mayra Rampal, Tanvi Yadav and Vaidurya Tripathi** participated in the first session of MUN.

## 3. General Information
