

BOLLYWOOD RESUMES SHOOTING, STRICT VIRUS RULES BAN 'ELABORATE & EXTRAVAGANT' SCENES



Filmmakers will not be allowed to film wedding scenes or fight sequences that have long been Bollywood staples. Furthermore, actors over the age of 65 are banned from being on set – a rule that would see some of India's most revered stars, such as 77year-old Amitabh Bachchan, forced to stay home instead.

Social distancing norms will put a stop to scenes showing actors kissing or embracing, spelling a return to the 1980s, when songs often cut to images of flowers brushing against each other, then a shorthand for romance.

Producers will also be required to have a doctor, nurse and an ambulance on set. The 16-page set of guidelines, framed by the Producers Guild of India, also includes a request for actors to do their hair and makeup at home, and urges casting directors to locate reallife relatives for family sequences to limit interactions with strangers


