

# **BIDEN-HARRIS TO LEAD US**

# BIDEN VOWS TO HEAL AMERICA

resident-elect Joe Biden called on Americans to put aside the divisiveness of the past four years under Donald Trump with a victory speech that promised swift action against the coronavirus pandemic and an orderly transfer of power after a bitter election. "Let's give each other a chance," Biden told a cheering, honking crowd at a drive-in rally on Saturday night in Wilmington, Delaware, hours after he clinched the presidency. "It's time to put away the harsh rhetoric... To lower the temperature... To see each other again... To listen to each other again... To make progress, we must stop treating our opponents as our enemy. We are not enemies. We are Americans," he said, even as Trump claimed victory for himself. He also promised a new tone of cooperation within the government, calling it "an inflection point." Let this grim era of demonisation in America begin to end here and now, he added.

#### INTERNATIONAL KIDS **FILM FESTIVAL GOES**


