**Dear Parents,
Greetings!**

In the month of November, children will engage in a variety of exciting learning experiences and hands-on activities. They will explore new concepts through creative art and craft projects, and interactive games that enhance critical thinking and teamwork. The focus will also be on developing reading, writing, and communication skills through fun worksheets, rhymes, and role-play. Along with academic learning, children will participate in value-based discussions and special assemblies to celebrate important events and foster social values.

In English, children learned about describing words through a fun and creative **“Sunshine Describing Craft”** activity. They made a bright and cheerful sun using cut-outs and wrote different describing words on its rays in their notebooks. This engaging activity helped them understand how adjectives make sentences more interesting. Children also completed various exercises related to the topic to strengthen their understanding and usage of describing words in everyday writing.

In Math our children participated in an exciting **Measuring Activity** using real-life objects from their surroundings. They explored the concepts of **length, weight, and different spans** through hands-on experiences. By comparing and measuring objects, children learned to use non-standard units like hand spans, footsteps, and pencils to understand measurement in a fun and practical way. This engaging activity helped them connect classroom learning with real-world applications while enhancing their observation and estimation skills.

In EVS children engaged in a fun and meaningful activity where they **created the National Flag of India** and learned to write the **National Anthem** with pride. Alongside, they expressed their creativity by making **beautiful posters of their favourite festivals**, celebrating India’s diverse culture. This activity helped children develop a sense of **patriotism, creativity, and cultural awareness** while enjoying hands-on learning. In the chapter on **Places of Worship**, children explored different temples, mosques, churches, and gurudwaras, learning about their importance in people’s lives. 
