With this motto, on 10th and 11th October, Blue Bells Models School hosted the **BBIMUN'25. Mayra Rampal** participated in the event with an aim to dig deep and research, brainstorm, and come up with solutions for the gravest of issues.

The month of October ushers in the festive season and the spirit of caring and sharing. To express our love and gratitude to the members of society by sharing and caring for them, the school organised a **Donation Drive** for the old and destitutes of Earth Saviours Foundation. The students and the teachers generously donated to this noble cause.

As part of the Caring and Sharing Week, a joyful **Potluck** was conducted where students shared homemade dishes, celebrating the values of kindness, cooperation, and sharing.

A Rangoli Making Inter-House Competition was organized on 9th October as part of the Diwali celebrations. The event provided students with an opportunity to showcase their creativity and artistic skills through vibrant and intricate designs symbolizing the spirit of the festival. Project Veer Gatha was instituted to disseminate the inspiring stories and acts of bravery of the Gallantry Awardees among students. The initiative seeks to acquaint young minds with the courage, sacrifice, and patriotism of these brave hearts, fostering a sense of national pride and gratitude. As part of this initiative, our students designed informative and visually appealing PowerPoint presentations (PPTs) highlighting the valour and dedication of these real-life heroes.

Role Play – **Educating through Enacting** was conducted with reference to the play— 'The Book that Saved the Earth' in Grade X English NCERT textbook. This activity was done to enable the students to understand the plot and characters, and the sequence of incidents in the play. The objective of this event was to unveil the diverse competencies of students and also to help them develop necessary language skills.

In Biology, students practically learned that germinating seeds release carbon dioxide during respiration, and potassium hydroxide (KOH) is used to absorb the released CO₂. This helped them understand that respiration is a biological process in living organisms and that KOH can be used to detect carbon dioxide. They also studied the structure of a dicot seed through practical experimentation.

This month, we celebrated the value of **Gratitude**—the practice of appreciating the kindness and opportunities we receive and giving back to our community. As part of this month's theme, students were encouraged to donate to support those in need. This is an opportunity for us to express our gratitude by helping others who may be going through challenging times.


📢 IHS News –
