Our students experienced the excitement of festivals, the warmth of sharing and caring, and the thrill of participating in diverse activities. From Diwali celebrations to the Maadhyam inter-school event, each experience helped nurture values of **kindness, teamwork, and gratitude**.

✨ **Special Days & Celebrations**

World Post Office Day: Students explored how letters and parcels travel across the world through the postal system. They shared stories of sending letters to loved ones and even created their own imaginary postcards, understanding the importance of communication in the old days before mobile phones.

Diwali Celebrations: The school was abuzz with festive joy as corridors were adorned with decorations. Students exchanged sweets and shared how they celebrate Diwali at home, spreading happiness and festive cheer all around. As part of the Festival Feast – Homemade Sweets Activity, students brought delightful homemade sweets prepared with love by their families, sharing them with friends and learning the joy of sharing while appreciating the taste of traditional treats from different homes. In the Diya Decoration activity, with brushes, colors, and creativity, students beautifully painted and decorated clay diyas made in their pottery class; their vibrant creations added sparkle to the celebration, reflecting their excitement for the festival of lights.

Sharing and Caring Week: This week was all about spreading kindness. Students engaged in storytelling, discussions, and simple acts of care like helping a friend or writing thank-you notes. Each activity encouraged empathy and taught them that even small gestures can make a big difference. Participating in a **Praise Parade**, **students** carried vibrant placards with kindness slogans, marching around the school in a joyful parade. With smiles and cheers, they inspired everyone to be kind, respectful, and caring towards others. In a creative and heartwarming **Caring Champion Intra-Class Competition**, students dressed up as superheroes representing different acts of kindness — from helping the needy to saving the planet. They spoke about their “superpowers” of compassion, proving that real heroes wear hearts, not capes. As part of Sharing and Caring Week, our students came together with open hearts for a **Donation Drive**, contributing household essentials, groceries, and daily-use items to support those in need. The spirit of generosity and compassion was evident in every contribution. Students of Grades XI and XII also visited the **Earth Saviours Foundation**, an NGO dedicated to caring for the elderly, abandoned, and underprivileged, where they personally handed over the donations. This meaningful experience gave students a deeper understanding of empathy, kindness, and social responsibility. It was a heartwarming reminder that even small acts of giving can truly brighten someone’s life.

Students actively participated in the “**Run for Unity**” organized at the school to celebrate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron Man of India. The event was designed to foster a sense of unity, strength, and patriotism among young minds. Carrying placards and chanting slogans promoting national integration, the students ran together to symbolize harmony and collective power. This meaningful activity not only inspired them to embrace the values of togetherness and national pride but also reflected Sardar Patel’s vision of a united India.

Academic Learning

English: The concept of verbs came alive through an energetic Dumb Charades activity where students acted out different actions, learning words through movement and fun. They also practiced *has*, *have*, and *had* through the engaging “Who Has What?” game, using these words correctly in sentences and building confidence in both speaking and grammar.

Mathematics: Students discovered the relationship between multiplication and division using hands-on manipulatives and real-life examples. They participated in an “*Equal Sharing*” activity using Math Lab blocks, dividing them among friends to understand how division means sharing equally. Group activities and problem-solving games made the concept fun, clear, and enjoyable for everyone.

EVS: To celebrate the diversity of India, students came dressed in traditional attire representing various festivals. They shared stories, songs, and customs, deepening their understanding of India’s rich cultural heritage.

Monthly vocabulary lists help students learn new words, understand meanings, and use them correctly in sentences. Fun class activities like word games, storytelling, and writing tasks make learning engaging and help students use these words confidently in everyday communication.

The Value of the Month was Gratitude which resonated with the spirit of giving prevalent through the month. Through discussions, storytelling, and reflection activities, students learned to appreciate the people and things that make their lives special. They connected the idea of gratitude to *Sharing and Caring Week*, expressing thankfulness through cards and kind words.

Swachh Bharat Diwas (SBD) was also observed on 2nd October 2025 to pay tribute to the **Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi**, on his Jayanti. As part of the **Swachhata Hi Sewa (SHS)** Campaign 2025, themed “Swachhotsav”, the school organized a series of activities to spread awareness about cleanliness, hygiene, and sustainable living. A **selfie point** was set up at the school entrance where students enthusiastically clicked pictures to promote the message of Swachhata. **Hand Wash Day** was observed, during which teachers demonstrated the correct steps and timings of hand washing with soap, emphasizing its importance in maintaining good health. Students also participated in **slogan-writing competitions and awareness rallies**, raising slogans on Swachhata Hi Sewa and Swachhotsav. They watched an informative video on personal hygiene, which encouraged them to adopt healthy habits in daily life. A **Swachhata School Exhibition** was another highlight of the day. Students creatively made small dustbins at home using recycled materials to collect pencil shavings and placed them on their desks, promoting the ideas of **recycling and cleanliness**. The campaign not only inspired students to keep their surroundings clean but also instilled in them the values of **hygiene, responsibility, and collective action**, thereby reinforcing the vision of a **Swachh Bharat**.

The **5th Annual Interschool Event, Maadhyam 2025 – Reboot the Bard**, was successfully hosted on 15th October, bringing together students from various schools in a spectacular celebration of talent and creativity. Every year, the event adopts a new theme, and this year’s theme combined Shakespeare’s timeless brilliance with a Gen Beta twist, where classic dramas were reimaged in modern, youth-inspired styles across different events. While our school was the host and did not officially compete, our students shone brilliantly — according

to the judges' grading, we topped 5 out of 8 events! The day was filled with creativity, energy, and enthusiasm, making it a proud and memorable celebration of young voices giving a fresh, contemporary spin to the Bard.

The **Space Explorers Workshop** provided an engaging STEM learning experience for our Grade II students at IHS. They explored the wonders of light, discovering how visibility, shadows, and reflections work through exciting hands-on experiments.

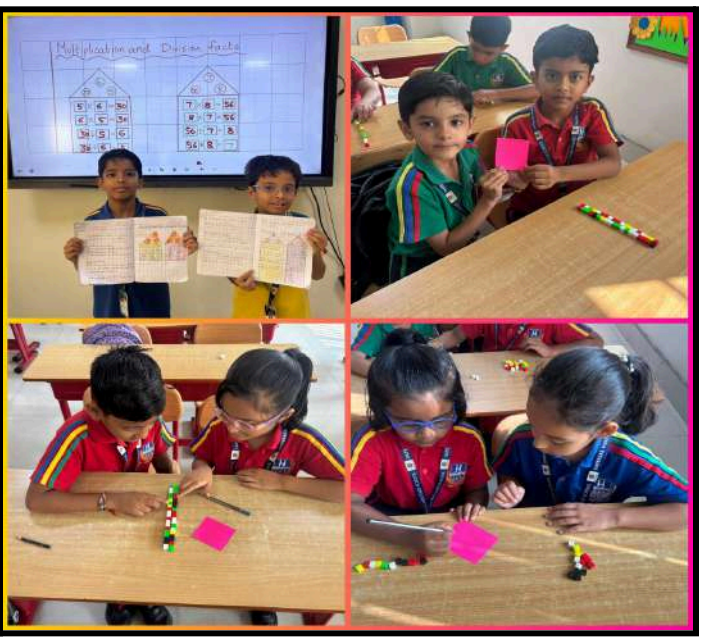
