With the successful completion of Term I, we have now stepped into Term II with renewed enthusiasm and determination. The month of October was filled with joyful learning experiences. Being the month of festivals, it brought excitement and cheer to our classrooms. Students not only participated in fun-filled activities but also gained valuable lessons through them.

On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, students enthusiastically participated in an art activity, drawing and coloring pictures of Mahatma Gandhi. Through this creative exercise, they not only showcased their artistic talents but also gained a deeper understanding of Gandhi Ji's life and ideals. The activity highlighted the values of truth, non-violence, and simplicity, helping students connect with his timeless principles. It proved to be both enjoyable and inspiring, serving as a meaningful tribute to the Father of the Nation.

Swachh Bharat Diwas (SBD) was also observed to pay tribute to the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi, on his Jayanti. As part of the Swachhata Hi Sewa (SHS) Campaign 2025, themed "Swachhotsav", the school organized a series of activities to spread awareness about cleanliness, hygiene, and sustainable living. A selfie point was set up at the school entrance where students enthusiastically clicked pictures to promote the message of Swachhata. Hand Wash Day was observed, during which teachers demonstrated the correct steps and timings of hand washing with soap, emphasizing its importance in maintaining good health. Students also participated in slogan-writing competitions and awareness rallies, raising slogans on Swachhata Hi Sewa and Swachhotsav. They watched an informative video on personal hygiene, which encouraged them to adopt healthy habits in daily life. A Swachhata School Exhibition was another highlight of the day. Students creatively made small dustbins at home using recycled materials to collect pencil shavings and placed them on their desks, promoting the ideas of recycling and cleanliness. The campaign not only inspired students to keep their surroundings clean but also instilled in them the values of hygiene, responsibility, and collective action, thereby reinforcing the vision of a Swachh Bharat.

The 5th Annual Interschool Event, Maadhyam 2025 – Reboot the Bard, was successfully hosted on 15th October, bringing together students from various schools in a spectacular celebration of talent and creativity. Every year, the event adopts a new theme, and this year's theme combined Shakespeare's timeless brilliance with a Gen Beta twist, where classic dramas were reimagined in modern, youth-inspired styles across different events. While our school was the host and did not officially compete, our students shone brilliantly — according to the judges' grading, we topped 5 out of 8 events! The day was filled with creativity, energy, and enthusiasm, making it a proud and memorable celebration of young voices giving a fresh, contemporary spin to the Bard.

World Animal Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm. To mark the occasion, students created animal shelters using waste materials, showcasing their creativity and concern for animals. This activity helped them understand the importance of caring for all living beings while promoting the idea of reuse and sustainability.

Students stepped into the shoes of a space scientists workshop, studying how Mars rovers explore the Red Planet. They drew parallels between rovers and living organisms, identifying important parts like wheels, robotic arms, cameras, masts, antennas, and power sources that help the machines function in space.

World Post Office Day was celebrated to help students understand the importance of the postal system and the valuable services it provides. Students learned about the journey of a letter—from writing and stamping to delivery. To make the day more engaging, they participated in a hands-on activity where they designed and wrote their own postcards and envelopes, expressing their thoughts creatively. This activity not only enhanced their writing skills but also gave them an appreciation for traditional means of communication.

The school celebrated the annual Caring and Sharing Week. Students celebrated "Give a Compliment Day," where they wrote heartfelt messages for their friends on specially designed badges. They also created beautiful "Thank You Didi" cards to express appreciation for the school nannies and support staff. The week concluded with a melodious competition titled "Share and Care Symphony," where students showcased their creativity by composing poems and songs that celebrated the joy of sharing and caring. As part of Sharing and Caring Week, our students came together with open hearts for a Donation Drive, contributing household essentials, groceries, and daily-use items to support those in need. The spirit of generosity and compassion was evident in every contribution. Students of Grades XI and XII also visited the Earth Saviours Foundation, an NGO dedicated to caring for the elderly, abandoned, and underprivileged, where they personally handed over the donations. In **English**, students learned about tenses through videos and real-life examples that made the concept more engaging and meaningful. The videos helped them visualize how different tenses are used in everyday situations, while real-life examples allowed them to connect grammar rules with their own experiences. Through discussions and practice activities, students were able to identify verb tenses correctly and use them in sentences with greater confidence. This interactive approach made the lesson enjoyable and improved their understanding of how tenses function in both spoken and written communication.

In **Mathematics** class, in the Operations on Fractional numbers chapter, **Fraction Scavenger Hunt** was organized, the classroom was transformed into a **fraction treasure hunt**. Fraction problems were hidden around the room, and students had to find and solve them. Each correct answer earned points, motivating students to think quickly and accurately while reinforcing their understanding of fractions in an enjoyable, hands-on way.

In EVS chapter Teeth and Tongue, students engaged in a variety of creative and educational activities to understand dental health and hygiene. They designed posters on dental care, highlighting the importance of brushing and maintaining oral hygiene. Students also built 3D models of teeth to learn about different types of teeth and their functions. 3. General Information
