• <u>Space Workshop</u>: The students engaged in an advanced engineering challenge by building hydrobots — water-powered machines that demonstrated fluid pressure, hydraulic systems, and Pascal's Law. The workshop was not only interactive and fun but also a great way to build 21st-century skills like creativity, critical thinking, teamwork, and problem-solving. Students gained hands-on STEM experience, learned to apply science in real-world contexts, and were inspired to dream big about space exploration and innovation.

• Caring and Sharing Week:

- <u>Donation Drive</u>: The students kick-started the Sharing and Caring Week with the Donation drive. Students brought dry rations to donate to those in need at an NGO, Earth Saviours Foundation.
- <u>Diwali Card</u>: Students also designed beautiful greeting cards highlighting the festive cheer.

Subject Enrichment Activities:

In English, the students studied a poem about the Laburnum tree in the school grounds. They observed the trees around and described how trees add beauty to human lives without any monetary value.
