Dear Parents,

Greetings!!

The month of November brings a pleasant change in the weather, with cool breezes and the beginning of winter. After the excitement of the festival season, children will return to school with fresh energy and enthusiasm. November will be a month filled with learning, fun, and creativity. Students will take part in various classroom and outdoor activities that help them grow in confidence and skills.

The joyful celebration of festivals, the month of October brought a sense of renewed energy and excitement among the children. They returned to school with happy faces, sharing their festive experiences with friends and teachers. The post-festival atmosphere was filled with enthusiasm as students settled back into their learning routine. Various classroom activities encouraged creativity, teamwork, and participation, helping children reconnect with their studies while still carrying the festive cheer in their hearts.

The children enjoyed exploring the letters **Pp**, **Qq**, **Rr**, and **Ss** through a variety of engaging and hands-on activities. They learned the correct formation of each letter by tracing, writing in sand, and practising on worksheets, which helped improve their fine motor skills. The children also learned the sounds of these letters — /p/ for parrot, pencil, and pumpkin; /q/ for queen and quilt; /r/ for rabbit, rainbow, and rose; and /s/ for sun, star, and snake. To make learning more exciting, fun-filled art and craft activities were organized. Children made colorful paper parrots for letter Pp, decorated a beautiful queen's crown for Qq, created a hopping rabbit craft for Rr, and designed a bright shining sun for Ss. Through rhymes, stories, and phonics games, they reinforced letter recognition and pronunciation. These activities not only made learning enjoyable but also helped children confidently identify the letters, relate them to familiar objects, and use their sounds in daily conversations. The excitement and creativity displayed by the children made this learning experience truly delightful.

This month, children were introduced to numbers 23 to 32 under the concept of Tens and Ones. They learned to understand that two-digit numbers are made up of groups of tens and ones through fun and interactive activities like using ice-cream sticks, beads, abacus and blocks for counting. This

hands-on learning helped them visualize numbers and strengthen their early place value understanding.

Under the **Pre-Math concept** – **Tall and Short**, children observed and compared the height of different objects and even their classmates. Activities such as arranging pencils, bottles, and blocks from tall to short helped them easily grasp the concept through observation and play.

The shape of the month was the **Star**, which fascinated the children. They learned to identify and trace the star shape and created beautiful star crafts using glitter, paper, and colours. These activities enhanced their fine motor skills and creativity while helping them recognize shapes in their surroundings. Overall, the month was filled with joyful learning experiences that made math fun, engaging, and meaningful for the children.

The theme of the month was "Celebration," which helped children understand the joy and significance of festivals. They learned about different types of festivals such as national, religious, and harvest festivals, and discussed how each festival brings people together in love and happiness. Through stories, videos, and classroom discussions, children explored how we celebrate festivals by decorating our homes, lighting diyas, singing songs, and sharing sweets with family and friends.

They also learned about the **special food** and **traditional clothes** associated with various festivals, which helped them appreciate the rich cultural diversity of our country. As part of the **theme craft**, children enjoyed making creative art pieces that reflected the festive spirit. They made beautiful **Ganesha Crafts** using colourful paper and decorative materials, which not only enhanced their fine motor skills but also deepened their understanding of diwali celebrations. These engaging activities filled the classroom with excitement and joy, allowing children to experience the true meaning of togetherness, sharing, and celebration through fun and creativity.

The month of October was filled with a variety of engaging and joyful activities that kept children motivated and enthusiastic. We celebrated **World Post**Office Day by setting up a post office in the school, where children learned how mail and postcards are sent and explored the various roles of postal workers. This hands-on experience helped them understand the importance of communication in everyday life. The Colour Burst – Orange activity encouraged children to explore shades, mix colors, and express their creativity, while the **Bird Family Craft** helped them learn about different birds and their features through hands-on art. In preparation for **Diwali**, children made beautiful **Diwali Crafts**, including **Ganesha Crafts** and **Candle Holder Decorations**, which enhanced their fine motor skills and filled the classroom with festive cheer. The **Parent Involvement Diwali activity** encouraged families to actively engage in celebrating together, strengthening the home-school connection.

During Caring and Sharing Week, children participated in thoughtful activities such as making Thank You Crafts for Support Staff and Sharing My Toy Activity, fostering empathy, kindness, and social responsibility. As part of Sharing and Caring Week, our students came together with open hearts for a Donation Drive, contributing household essentials, groceries, and daily-use items to support those in need. The spirit of generosity and compassion was evident in every contribution. Students of Grades XI and XII also visited the Earth Saviours Foundation, an NGO dedicated to caring for the elderly, abandoned, and underprivileged, where they personally handed over the donations. This meaningful experience gave students a deeper understanding of empathy, kindness, and social responsibility. It was a heartwarming reminder that even small acts of giving can truly brighten someone's life.

During the English Rhyme Intra-Class Competition, children showcased their confidence, pronunciation, and memorization skills, making the event

lively and inspiring.

The month concluded with Halloween Celebrations (Bagless Day), where children dressed up in costumes, participated in fun games, and created the Rocking Witch Craft, adding an element of excitement and creativity to the festivities.

The value of the month was **Gratitude**, which helped children understand the importance of being thankful for the people, things, and experiences in their lives. Through various activities, children learned to express appreciation towards their teachers, friends, family, and support staff. Activities like making Thank You Crafts, sharing kind words, and participating in Caring and Sharing Week encouraged children to recognize and acknowledge the efforts of others. As part of the Swachhata Hi Sewa (SHS) Campaign 2025, themed "Swachhotsav", the school organized a series of activities to spread awareness about cleanliness, hygiene, and sustainable living. A selfie point was set up at the school entrance where students enthusiastically clicked pictures to promote the message of Swachhata. Hand Wash Day was observed, during which teachers demonstrated the correct steps and timings of hand washing with soap, emphasizing its importance in maintaining good health. Students also participated in slogan-writing competitions and awareness rallies, raising slogans on Swachhata Hi Sewa and Swachhotsav. They watched an informative video on personal hygiene, which encouraged them to adopt healthy habits in daily life. A Swachhata School Exhibition was another highlight of the day. Students creatively made small dustbins at home using recycled materials to collect pencil shavings and placed them on their desks, promoting the ideas of recycling and cleanliness. The campaign not only inspired students to keep their surroundings clean but also instilled in them the values of hygiene, responsibility, and collective action, thereby reinforcing the vision of a Swachh Bharat.

The 5th Annual Interschool Event, Maadhyam 2025 – Reboot the Bard, was successfully hosted on 15th October, bringing together students from various schools in a spectacular celebration of talent and creativity.
