On the academic front, students learned various topics and concepts through engaging and interactive activities. Emphasis was placed on developing language, math, and cognitive skills, helping students build confidence and a positive attitude toward their studies.

In **Literacy**, students delved into the world of vowels and consonants, with a focus on the 'e' and 'o' family words such as -en, -ed, -og and -op. They practiced constructing short sentences, identifying the odd one out, and enhancing their writing skills through Look and Write exercises. Learning was made enjoyable and engaging through interactive activities, word games, and storytelling sessions, which encouraged active participation and creativity. Students also learned and revised **sight words** regularly to build vocabulary and enhance reading skills. Through these fun and interactive methods, children developed a love for reading, improved their comprehension, and strengthened their confidence in using language effectively.

In **Numeracy**, students explored concepts of greater than, less than, and equal through engaging activities where they inserted the correct signs. They delved into the creative world of shapes, learning about the cone and other basic shapes through hands-on activities and visual aids. Students practiced backward counting from 40 to 0, identified missing numbers, and completed exercises on what comes before, between, and after. Regular revision of counting from 1 to 100 and learning number names from 1 to 4 to strengthen their foundational numeracy skills. Fun-filled activities, number games, and interactive exercises made learning enjoyable while enhancing logical thinking, observation skills, and problem-solving abilities, ensuring a well-rounded and holistic numeracy experience.

In **EVS**, students explored the fascinating world of festivals, learning about major Indian festivals, International celebrations, and National events. They discovered the special foods prepared during these occasions and the traditional attire worn, helping them appreciate cultural diversity and festive traditions. Through hands-on activities, children actively explored the essence of various national and regional festivals by creating crafts, participating in role-plays, and sharing their own experiences of celebrating festivals with family and friends. To add a festive touch, they also enjoyed learning a delightful Diwali rhyme, blending fun with education while embracing the spirit of the season.

Celebrating **World Post Office Day**, teachers brought a real-world experience to the classroom by setting up a mini post office in the school. They role-played as post office employees, demonstrating the complete process of mailing letters. Students actively participated by creating their own postcards, writing messages or love notes, and drawing pictures for their family members. They also learned about stamping and addressing letters, with teachers guiding them through each step. The activity included sorting and "posting" the letters, giving children a hands-on understanding of how a post office functions.

The Colour Burst- Orange Day was a lively and creative celebration filled with fun and learning. The children enthusiastically embraced the colour theme, coming dressed in orange attire and bringing orange-colored objects from home. They created adorable 'clown fish' crafts using plates, painting them and pasting various objects to make their artwork vibrant and engaging.
