September Highlights: A Month of Celebration, Learning & Values

As the timeless adage goes, *"The future of a country lies in the hands of its children and teachers."* This September, our school community came together to honour this very spirit—celebrating the guiding lights who shape tomorrow's leaders.

This month, we joyfully celebrated **Teachers' Day**, a heartfelt occasion to honour the guiding lights who nurture young minds. Students expressed their gratitude through beautifully crafted cards, thoughtful gifts, and sincere messages, filling the atmosphere with love, respect, and appreciation for their mentors.

On **International Literacy Day**, students celebrated the spirit of learning and gratitude by showering their class didis with heartfelt greetings and tokens of love. Their thoughtful gestures reflected not only appreciation but also the values of empathy and inclusion that literacy inspires.

Grade I-A presented a delightful **morning assembly** themed around World Country Music Day, celebrating Indian folk traditions. The day began with the Gayatri Mantra, followed by global news updates and a lively current affairs quiz that sparked curiosity and engagement.

On 14th September, students celebrated **Hindi Diwas** with great enthusiasm by reciting poems using colorful props, which made their performances lively and engaging. Through this celebration, they learned about the cultural and linguistic significance of Hindi as our national language and understood how it connects people across the country. Students also participated in interactive activities such as **Kavita Vachan** (poetry recitation) which helped enhance their vocabulary, pronunciation, and confidence in speaking Hindi. The day encouraged a love for the language, fostered creativity, and gave students an opportunity to express themselves while appreciating the richness of Hindi literature and tradition.

Celebrating **First Aid Day**, students learned the basics of first aid from the school nurse and created their own first aid kits, understanding the importance of being prepared during emergencies.

To mark **World River Day**, students participated in **river montage activity** to spread awareness about the importance of protecting rivers and conserving water. Through this activity, they learned how small efforts, like creating thoughtful collaboration of pictures, can inspire people to care for the environment and keep rivers clean for the future.

In **Math** students explored the difference between flat and solid shapes through hands-on activities. Using sticks and clay dough, they built 3D models and connected their learning to real-life objects for deeper understanding.

Through simple experiments, students discovered the properties of air and weather in **EVS**. They felt the presence of air by blowing on paper and created posters advocating against deforestation, linking trees to the oxygen we breathe.

In **English** the concept of pronouns was introduced through an engaging video story. Students then created a vibrant “Garden of Pronouns,” where each flower represented a newly learned word. They also learnt uses of has and have by telling 2 sentences for their friends. A vocabulary list is uploaded regularly for students. It is also practiced in class to help them learn the spelling, meaning, and usage of new words. This activity strengthens their reading, writing, and speaking skills, while encouraging them to use the words confidently in daily communication.

September’s core value was **Hard Work**. Through inspiring stories and discussions, students learned that perseverance and effort are the true keys to success. As one quote beautifully puts it: “*There is no substitute for hard work.*” — Thomas Edison

For **Dussehra Activity** kids joyfully crafted vibrant Dussehra effigies, bringing the festive spirit alive. Each child proudly carried home their creation—a symbol of triumph and tradition. Smiles lit up the room as little hands shaped stories of good over evil. Students also explorers brought their memories to life in vibrant A-4 trip collages. From mountains to museums, each sheet told a joyful tale of adventure. Tiny hands and big smiles turned travel tales into colourful keepsakes for **Tourism Tales**.

Grade I voices sparkled with confidence at the **English Recitation Competition**. Each child stepped up with poise, delivering poems and passages straight from the heart. Applause filled the air as young speakers brought words to life with charm and clarity. To acknowledge overall excellence and to recognize the achievement of our brilliant students.

Celebrating Excellence in Teaching

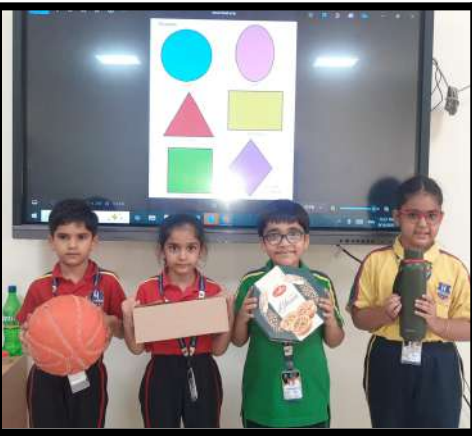

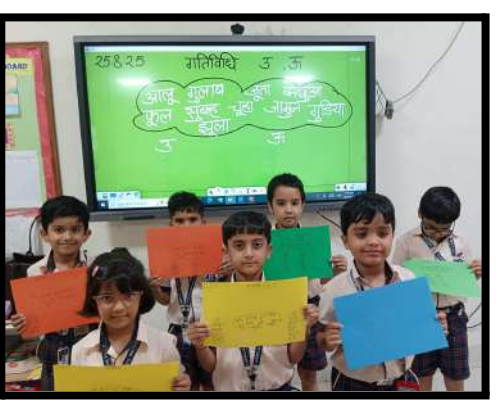
