The session aimed to understand the participation of women in the workforce and its implications for the Indian economy.

The discussion highlighted factors such as socio-cultural barriers, unequal access to education and skills, lower wages, and concentration of women in informal and unorganized sectors. We also compared rural and urban trends, noting that rural women show relatively higher participation, mostly in agricultural and casual labor, while urban women often face challenges of limited opportunities and social restrictions.

The value of the month was *Hard Work* the students were encouraged to inculcate the same and show up their hardwork and dedication in the Term I examinations.






#### **Celebrating Excellence in Teaching**


