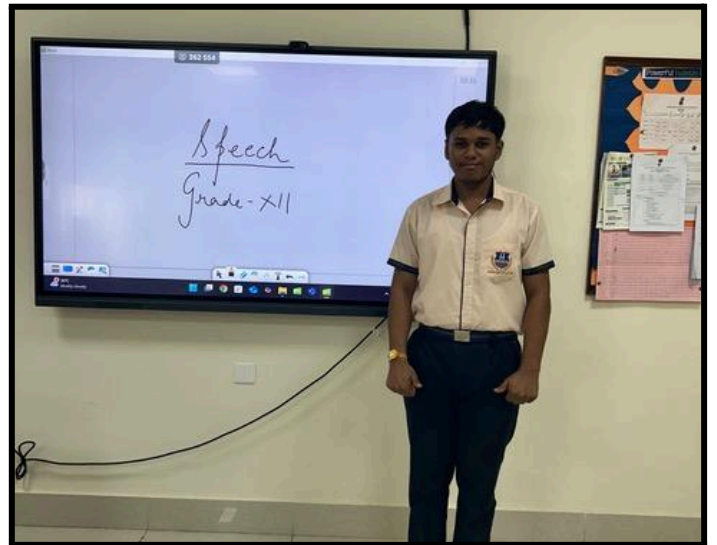
Celebrating Excellence in Teaching
