**Greetings and good wishes!**

The month of **October** is seen by many to be a time of real seasonal change, where the nights start getting cooler. It also kicks in the festive season and the air rings aloud with cheer. The month of August closed with **National Sports Day** which is the birth anniversary of the legendary Indian hockey player, Major Dhyan Chand. The students participated in fun races and enjoyed them thoroughly, maintaining a healthy competitive spirit.

The month of September had a plethora of activities. **Teacher's Day** celebration in school is a chance to strengthen the teacher-student bond, foster a culture of appreciation, and create lasting memories for everyone involved.

As we stepped into this month, we embarked on a fresh academic journey filled with opportunities for growth, learning, and personal development.

 **International Literacy Day –**

On International Literacy Day, children celebrated with joy and creativity. Children engaged in daily interactions using basic etiquette words such as "sorry," "thank you," and "welcome" with their nannies and peers. Through guided conversations and role-play, they learned the importance of polite communication. This activity helped reinforce respect, kindness and social awareness in everyday situations.

**First Aid Day** -- On First Aid Day, is observed on the second Saturday of September each year. Children learned the importance of quick help during emergencies with the guidance of the school nurse. They were taught how to treat minor cuts, burns, and nosebleeds, and how to stay calm in stressful situations. They arranged and understood the different things that are required in the First Aid box.

**Hindi Diwas** – Hindi Diwas is celebrated to cherish Indian culture and promote the Hindi language. It is an attempt to show respect. Students enthusiastically recited different Hindi poems using props. The day highlighted the significance of Hindi as a cultural and linguistic identity.

**World River Day**-The students participated in a fun and educational activity on the **Water Cycle and the Importance of Rivers**. The aim was to help students understand how rivers play a vital role in maintaining the water cycle and supporting life.

**World Tourism Day**-To celebrate **World Tourism Day**, the students actively participated in a vibrant and educational activity where they shared experiences of their **best trip**. They brought pictures to visually showcase their travel experience. The objective of the activity was to help students appreciate the value of tourism, learn about different places, and improve their research and presentation skills.

### **Subject Highlights –**

- **English** – In English, children learned about Articles (a, an, the) and Doing Words (verbs) through engaging activities. They practiced identifying and using articles correctly in sentences. To reinforce verbs, they played a lively game of Dumb Charades, where they acted out various actions while their friends guessed the verbs—making learning both active and fun!
- **Math** – In Math, children explored the concepts of multiplication and division through an interactive block-sharing activity. They grouped and shared blocks to visually understand how numbers are combined and split. This hands-on approach helped them grasp the relationship between the two operations in a fun and meaningful way.
- **EVS** – In EVS, children learned about 'Our Clothes' and understood why clothes are important for protection and comfort. They discussed how we wear different clothes in different seasons – cotton clothes in summer, woollen clothes in winter, and raincoats in the rainy season. They also explored the chapter 'Our Home', learning that homes keep us safe, comfortable, and protected. Through pictures and stories, they discovered different types of houses like huts, apartments, bungalows, and houseboats, and how homes vary based on climate, location, and lifestyle.

### **Value of the Month – Hard work –**

As part of the "**Hard Work Jar**" activity, children wrote about how consistent effort leads to success. A jar was kept in the classroom, and each time a student showed hard work—by completing a task, helping others, or showing improvement—a **marble/star** was added. Once the jar was full, the class enjoyed a small celebration, learning that small acts of hard work lead to big rewards.

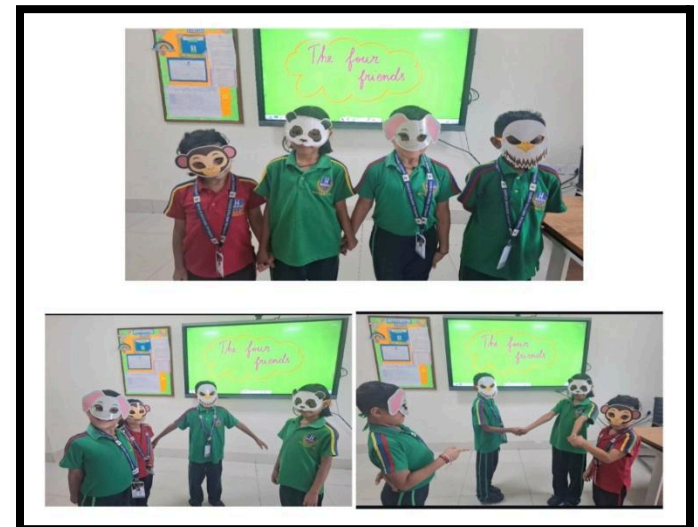
