A day prior to Teacher's day, adding to the sentiment, a class presented a thoughtful performance that highlighted the **evolving challenges faced by teachers today-** from managing diverse learners to changing expectations. It was a touching reminder of how a teacher not only imparts knowledge but also **shapes the life, career, and character of a child, guiding them to become responsible, compassionate and civilized citizens of the nation.** 

To mark *Hindi Diwas*, students celebrated the day with enthusiasm and pride. On this occasion, they learnt the importance of our national language, Hindi, which binds us together and reflects the rich cultural heritage of India. Various activities helped students appreciate the beauty of the language and inspired them to use and respect Hindi in their daily lives.

On **September 8, International Literacy Day**, students celebrated the power and importance of literacy by teaching **magic words** to the school nannies. This activity not only **showcased how language can connect people** but also **reinforced good manners**, **kindness**, **and empathy** among the children.

World First Aid Day was observed with the aim of making children aware of essential life skills. Through an interactive presentation and a practical demonstration by the school nurse, students learned how to apply basic first aid. The activity emphasized the importance of staying calm and acting responsibly in emergencies, empowering students to handle unexpected situations with care.

On World River Day, celebrated on 22nd September, our students created their own mini rivers on paper plates using paints, blue paper, and other craft materials, and then pasted cutouts of river creatures like fish, frogs, turtles, and ducks. Through this hands-on activity, they learned about different aquatic animals, the importance of rivers as habitats, and the need to keep rivers clean. It also helped them develop creativity and fine motor skills. The colorful river displays turned the classroom into a lively "River Gallery", where students shared interesting facts about the creatures and gained a better understanding of how rivers support life and why they must be protected.

To celebrate **World Tourism Day**, students brought pictures of historical icons such as the Taj Mahal, India Gate, and other famous landmarks. They colored and decorated these pictures in class, learning about the cultural and historical significance of these sites. The activity helped students appreciate heritage, explore famous monuments, and express creativity through art.

On **National Sports Day**, students celebrated with great enthusiasm by participating in various races and athletic activities. The event encouraged team spirit, sportsmanship, and physical fitness, while giving students the opportunity to have fun, compete, and stay active.

As part of the **Value of the Month**, students explored the importance of *hard work*. They watched inspiring videos that highlighted how determination and effort lead to success. After the discussions, students created their own slogans on hard work, expressing their ideas creatively. This activity helped them understand the value of perseverance, encouraged positive thinking, and motivated them to put consistent effort into achieving their goals.

Each activity was not merely a task, but a stepping stone in shaping empathy, responsibility, and awareness in our learners. September's journey beautifully prepared us for the vibrancy that October brings. As we embrace this new month, may the glow of the festive season fill our lives with positivity, knowledge, and joy. Together, let us guide our children to not only celebrate festivals with enthusiasm but also carry forward the values of kindness, respect, and resilience that they represent.

Children also did a lot of hands-on activities in different subjects to understand various concepts which were introduced to them. In English, as part of the "Articles" chapter, students made pictures of different nouns and wrote their names on chits. They exchanged chits with partners and framed sentences using a, an, and the with the nouns they received. This activity helped them practice articles, build sentences, and reinforce grammar in a fun and creative way. In addition, students were introduced to the "Verbs" chapter as action words through fun activities. They cut out action words from newspapers and magazines and pasted them in their notebooks. They also matched nouns and pronouns with verbs like is, am, are, was, were, has, have, and had, and enacted action words picked from chits. These interactive tasks made learning verbs enjoyable, clear, and memorable.

In E.V.S, children explored the chapter *Birds Around Us* with curiosity and excitement. They learned about the **parts of a bird's body**—head, trunk, tail, wings, and feathers—through interactive videos and discussions. The lesson highlighted the **different types of beaks, claws, and feathers**, their functions, and how they help birds like sparrows, eagles, and wading birds adapt to their surroundings. To deepen understanding, students engaged in two creative activities. In the first, they used **hand impressions to design colourful birds**, complete with branches and feet, showcasing their artistic skills. In the second, they played a fun "**Roll the Dice**" **game** with beaks and claws, describing their uses as the dice rolled. These activities made learning lively, helping students appreciate the diversity of birds and their unique adaptations.

In **Mathematics**, our young learners embarked on an exciting journey into the world of **fractions** through two creative and interactive activities. In the first activity, "**Fraction Flower**," students crafted their very own vibrant flowers, dividing each into different sections to represent fractions. They then highlighted their chosen parts,

visually demonstrating their understanding of how a whole can be split into equal parts. The second activity, "Is it a Fraction?", brought technology into learning! Children explored an engaging PowerPoint presentation, analyzing various images to determine whether they represented a fraction or not. This fun-filled activity not only strengthened their fraction skills but also encouraged critical thinking and observation. Through these hands-on and visually stimulating activities, students not only grasped the concept of fractions but also experienced learning in a creative, interactive, and memorable way.


