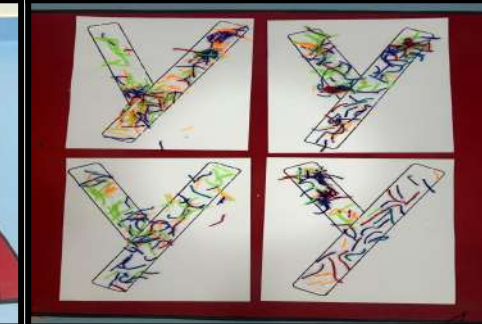
IHS News –
