Dear Parents, Greetings!!

October is the month of change of weather and celebration. The days grow cooler, leaves turn golden, and the air feels fresh with the arrival of autumn. It's a time of festivals like Diwali and Halloween, bringing joy and togetherness. October reminds us of transition, gratitude, and the beauty of new beginnings. It is also the season of harvest in many regions, symbolizing abundance and prosperity. With its blend of cultural traditions, festive lights, and nature's charm, October fills hearts with warmth and hope, making it one of the most cherished months of the year.

September was the month of learning and celebration. The spirit of Navratri filled the atmosphere with devotion and joy, while "Utsav" – Grandparents Day – was celebrated with full enthusiasm, love, and respect. Children actively participated in various activities, showcasing their talents and creativity. The month was filled with knowledge, values, and togetherness, leaving behind beautiful memories for everyone.

In Literacy, children learned the letters Mm, Nn, Oo, and Pp along with their sounds through fun and hands-on activities. Each letter was introduced with phonics, and children practiced the sounds many times to recognize them clearly. They traced letters in sand, shaped them with clay, and used flashcards, which helped improve both their letter formation and fine motor skills. Games like spotting objects beginning with /m/, /n/, /o/, and /p/ made the lessons exciting and meaningful. They also enjoyed creative crafts. Storytelling, rhymes, and songs added more fun, helping them connect sounds with words they know. These activities gave children the confidence to recognize and pronounce letters correctly and start using them in conversations and classwork.

In Numeracy, children learn the numbers 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22,23 and 24 under the concept of Tens and Ones. They practiced counting using concrete objects such as beads, sticks, and blocks to understand how numbers are formed. By grouping ten objects together and adding extra ones, they were able to clearly see the difference between the "tens" and the "ones" place. Activities like bundling ice-cream sticks into groups of ten and then adding loose sticks for ones made the concept more meaningful. Children also engaged in number games, sequencing, and writing practice to strengthen their recognition and understanding of these numbers. Along with number work, children explored the **pre-math concept of Heavy and Light**. Through

hands-on activities such as comparing classroom objects, they understood the difference in weight. They enjoyed sorting objects into groups of "heavy" and "light," which helped them develop observation, reasoning, and comparison skills in a fun way. Children also learned to identify a **square** by its properties – four equal sides and four corners. They traced and coloured square shapes, identified square objects in their surroundings (such as windows, dice, and tiles), and even created square art using paper folding and craft activities.

Through these activities, children developed a stronger foundation in numeracy, logical thinking, and shape recognition while enjoying hands-on, experiential learning.

In EVS, children explored the theme of "Animals" in an enjoyable and interactive way. They were introduced to animals through lively discussions, colourful picture cards, and real-life examples, which made learning relatable and fun. Children learned to identify different types of animals, including domestic animals like cows, dogs, and hens, wild animals like lions, elephants, and tigers, and aquatic animals like fish, dolphins, and turtles. They also explored animal habitats, understanding where different animals live—on land, in forests, near water, or in the sea. In addition, children learned about animals and their young ones, such as kittens, puppies, calves, and chicks, helping them understand growth and family in the animal world. Through these activities, children enhanced their observation and classification skills, developed curiosity about nature, and gained a basic understanding of animals, their homes, and their importance in our environment. Hands-on activities, storytelling, and picture-based learning made the concepts easy to grasp while keeping the children engaged and excited about learning.

In the month of September, children actively participated in a wide range of creative and educational activities that combined learning with fun. They began the month by making and decorating **Bouquets for My Grandparents**, learning to express love, gratitude, and care while improving their fine motor skills through cutting, pasting, and arranging the flowers. During **Colour Burst – Purple Day**, children explored the colour purple and created **Blooming Flowers Crafts**, practising colouring, cutting, and pasting, which enhanced their artistic skills and attention to detail.

Teachers' Day was celebrated with great fun and joy in our class. The little ones came happily and wished their teachers with bright smiles. They sang rhymes, danced, and clapped with excitement. The children made small cards and drawings to show their love. The class was filled with laughter, music, and cheerful voices. It was a simple but very joyful celebration, and the teachers felt very special.

First Aid Day was celebrated in our school in a very informative way. The school nurse conducted a special session for the children. She explained the importance of first aid and how it helps us in times of small injuries and emergencies. The nurse showed the children simple things like how to clean a cut, put a bandage, and call for help. She also displayed the items in a first aid box and told everyone how each one is used. The children listened carefully, asked questions, and even tried a few demonstrations. It was a very useful and interesting session that helped everyone understand the value of safety and care.

The value of the month was **Hardwork.** This month, students learned about the value of *hard work*. To understand its importance, they watched inspiring videos that showed how determination and effort lead to success. After the discussion, students expressed their own ideas creatively by writing different experiences they had on hard work. The activity motivated them to apply the value of hard work in their daily lives, both in studies and beyond.

Children also engaged in making Animals in the Forest Crafts, using their imagination to learn about different animals, their habitats, and unique characteristics, while developing observation and creativity. As part of **Dussehra and Durga Puja celebrations**, they made **Ram Finger Puppets**, which helped them understand the story of Lord Rama and the victory of good over evil, while also encouraging storytelling, role-play, and cultural

awareness. On the same day, during **Movie Masti (Bagless Day)**, children enjoyed an entertaining and educational movie, which promoted relaxation, social interaction, and shared enjoyment with their friends. Throughout September, these activities not only developed creativity, fine motor skills, and cognitive learning but also fostered cultural understanding, moral values, and social skills. The month was filled with joy, celebration, and meaningful experiences, making it memorable and enriching for all the children.
