Dear Parents, Greetings!

October is a month of mixed emotions, filled with heartfelt goodbyes, yet it also brings with it the joy of new beginnings and the festive spirit.

The highlight of the month was the Annual **Grandparents' Day (UTSAV)**. The pre-primary wing celebrated its Fourth Grandparents Day with warmth and splendour, bringing together tradition, joy, and deep appreciation. This year's theme was Navratri. Students paid tribute to the story of Mata Durga defeating the demon Mahishasura through an expressive enactment. Their performances were complemented by vibrant Navratri dances, full of rhythm, colour, and devotion. Their vibrant energy, graceful moves, and cheerful smiles truly lit up the atmosphere, making the day even more memorable. The children also expressed their love and gratitude by making beautiful photo frames, each one brimming with affection.

On the academic front, students explored various topics with great enthusiasm, actively participating in discussions, asking insightful questions, and demonstrating a keen interest in deepening their understanding. Their curiosity and engagement reflected a strong commitment to learning, making each session both productive and enjoyable.

In **EVS**, under the theme *Animals*, children learned about herbivores, omnivores, and carnivores, along with animal patterns, homes, and young ones. To make learning engaging, they took part in class discussions, shared prior knowledge, and connected it with real-life experiences. They also enjoyed hands-on craft activities related to animals. The children enjoyed diving into the underwater theme craft. They carefully pasted the legs and eyes and added fun decorations to bring their underwater animals to life. This hands-on activity sparked their creativity and helped improve their fine motor skills.

In **Numeracy**, students practiced oral counting from 1 to 100 and engaged in exercises focusing on before, after, in-between, and missing numbers to strengthen their number sense. They also learned the number names for 1 and 2, developing both recognition and writing skills. All previously learned shapes were recapitulated through an enjoyable and interactive activity, helping reinforce their understanding in a fun and engaging way. Their enthusiasm and active participation reflected a growing confidence in handling numbers and basic mathematical concepts.

In **Literacy**, students explored the vowel 'a' and practiced various words from the 'a' vowel family, including at, am, an, ag, ad, ab, and ap, enhancing both their reading and pronunciation skills. They engaged in interactive activities such as word games, matching exercises, and storytelling to reinforce these concepts in an enjoyable way. In addition, students learned and revised **sight words** to build their vocabulary, improving their recognition and usage in sentences. Through these activities, they not only strengthened their reading and writing abilities but also developed confidence in using new words while expressing themselves creatively.

Teachers' Day was celebrated with warmth and enthusiasm, as children learned about the significance of this special day. They were taught that Teachers' Day is celebrated on the birthday of **Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan**, a great philosopher and educator. Through a captivating story, students understood the important role teachers play in shaping lives. To express their respect and gratitude, the little ones joyfully honored their teachers with love, heartfelt wishes, and cheerful participation in classroom activities.

Hindi Diwas was a vibrant and educational celebration aimed at honoring our national language. Students enthusiastically recited Hindi rhymes, and a **Kavita Vachan** (poetry recitation) competition provided an excellent platform for them to showcase their love for Hindi through expressive and confident performances. The event fostered pride in the language and encouraged creativity in pronunciation and expression.

The Colour Burst activity for the month highlighted the color Purple, symbolizing imagination, dreams, and a spiritually calming effect on emotions. The children celebrated the day with great excitement, dressing beautifully in shades of purple. To complement the theme, they created a Blooming Flower craft using ear buds and colors. This hands-on activity not only nurtured creativity but also helped students identify and connect with the color in a fun and meaningful way.

On **World First Aid Day**, students participated in an engaging session led by the school nurse, who explained the importance of first aid and demonstrated simple, practical techniques. The children actively took part in the activities, gaining awareness about how first aid can be applied in everyday situations. The session helped instill a sense of responsibility and safety awareness among the young learners.
