The activity proved enriching as learners concluded that while dreams are necessary to inspire ambition, they must be grounded in reality to avoid disillusionment.

In **Business Studies**, an online quiz was conducted on Principles of Management. In **Accountancy**, students played online games on the Issue of shares. A **role play activity** was conducted for the **Sociology** students of Grade XII, where learners showcased various **social processes** such as **Sanskritization, Westernization,**

Secularization, and Industrialization, etc. The activity provided students with an interactive platform to understand these concepts through dramatization. It helped them connect theoretical ideas with real-life contexts in an engaging way. Students developed confidence, creativity, and collaborative learning skills. The learning objectives achieved were: strengthening conceptual clarity, enhancing communication skills, fostering critical thinking, and applying sociological concepts to practical situations.
