An orientation session was conducted to establish the **Entrepreneurship Club** in the school. The initiative was undertaken as a task assigned by **NEC Junior**, **E-Cell**, **HT Bombay**. The activity generated great enthusiasm and participation, instilling the spirit of innovation, leadership, and teamwork among students.

As part of the **History** subject enrichment to deepen critical engagement with India's freedom struggle, a student-led presentation was held focusing on "The Role of Mahatma Gandhi in the Indian National Movement." The event featured an insightful PowerPoint presentation curated and delivered by the students.

During the **Political Science** curriculum's exploration of federalism and identity politics, students delivered an intellectually engaging PowerPoint presentation on the theme "Regional Aspirations in India". The presentation. The session aimed to analyze the complex and diverse nature of regional identities in India and how these aspirations have shaped political discourse, demands for autonomy, and the restructuring of Indian federalism.






