In the **Chemistry** Lab, students analysed the functional groups in organic compounds that they were given. In **Physics lab**, students of Grade-XII performed an experiment to find the focal length of a convex lens.

As part of the **English** curriculum, a speech activity was conducted for the students of Grade XII with reference to the chapter "Going Places" by A.R. Barton. The theme "Daydreaming leads to Disillusionment" was chosen to help students connect literature with real-life experiences and reflect on the consequences of unrealistic fantasies. 
