Subject Highlights –

- **English** Students learned about pronouns through a fun notebook activity and a creative "Pronoun Puppet" exercise. This made grammar more interactive and memorable.
- Math The concept of shapes was reinforced through a hands-on activity where students created animals using different shapes, combining creativity with mathematical understanding.
- EVS Students explored how plants grow through a sprouting potato activity. Observing the changes over days helped them understand plant growth in a real and engaging way.






