Dear Parent,

As we step into the vibrant month of August, our school is brimming with enthusiasm and purpose. This month holds special significance for every Indian, as we celebrate our nation's Independence Day with pride and gratitude. The students come together to honor the sacrifices of our freedom fighters and reflect on our responsibilities as citizens of a free nation. August also marks **Heritage Week**, a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with the richness of our traditions, culture, and values. Through various activities, the students explored the diversity that makes India unique and learned to cherish our shared heritage. At the same time, August reminds us to focus on academics, as the **Term I Examinations** are approaching.

Let us have a look at all that students and teachers accomplished this rainy month.

- <u>Hiroshima Day:</u> On Hiroshima Day, students created a symbolic **Peace Tree** adorned with leaves carrying heartfelt messages of harmony, non-violence, and compassion. Each message reflected their hope for a world free of war and hatred. The activity instilled values of peace-building and global responsibility among the young learners.
- **NIE Movie:** The students went to see the movie 'Mahavatar Narsimha' on 4th August with their friends, and it was an experience they will cherish for a long time. The students watched in amazement the mythological tale of Prahlad and his selfless devotion to Lord Vishnu.
- General Assembly (VI A): The morning of August 5th began with a sense of solemn reflection as Class VI A took charge of the school assembly. The assembly was both informative and thought-provoking, aiming not only to carry out the routine proceedings but also to create awareness about an important historical event, "Hiroshima Day". The Assembly included School Prayer, Thought for the day, News update, Poem invoking peace and harmony across the world, and a hands-on quiz based on the theme.
- <u>General assembly (VI B):</u> The students started the day at school with a lot of confidence and fluency as they took reins of the morning assembly. The school song was also sung melodiously along with the thought of the day, a relevant affirmation, and news updates without any hitch. *Riyanshi Bhada and Shreyanshi Nayak* conducted an interactive quiz based on facts taken from the NIE paper.
- <u>WWGC Classroom Challenge</u>: WWF-India has launched 'Wild Wisdom Global Challenge 2025' and its theme is Incredible Insects. As the first round, a classroom challenge, featuring an objective-type pen-and-paper assessment, was held on Monday, August 11th, for Grades VI-IX. The top 2 student performers will represent the school in the city-level round.
- Har Ghar Tiranga: As part of the 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, students were encouraged to hoist the Indian National Flag at their homes to mark our nation's independence. They participated with great enthusiasm and built a personal connection with our Tiranga.

- Sanskrit Diwas: विश्व संस्कृत दिवस के शुभ अवसर पर हमारे विद्यालय में ड्राइंग और पेंटिंग गतिविधि आयोजित की गई। कक्षा षष्ठी के विद्यार्थियों ने इस गतिविधि में बढ़-चढ़कर भाग लिया। छात्रों ने संस्कृत भाषा, श्लोक, ओम् चिन्ह, वेदों तथा भारतीय संस्कृति से संबंधित सुंदर और भावपूर्ण चित्र बनाए। कई चित्रों में विद्यार्थियों ने "संस्कृतं जीवनम्", "श्लोकों में ज्ञान छिपा है" जैसे संदेशों को भी रंगों के माध्यम से प्रस्तुत किया। यह गतिविधि न केवल रचनात्मकता को बढ़ाने वाली थी, बल्कि इससे विद्यार्थियों में संस्कृत भाषा के प्रति सम्मान और रुचि भी उत्पन्न हुई। सभी ने बहुत आनंद के साथ भाग लिया और अपने कला-ज्ञान का सुंदर प्रदर्शन किया।
- Create a language poster: The students celebrated the vibrant cultural and linguistic diversity of India through a thoughtfully designed Language Poster Activity. Centered around Manipuri (Meiteilon) the official language of Manipur —the students explored and appreciated the richness of India's heritage. Grade VI students learned and wrote 5 greeting words in Manipuri, along with 5 greetings from other Indian languages.
- <u>Kalamkari on Waste CD</u>: Students turned discarded CDs into miniature canvases, painting intricate Kalamkari-inspired motifs with fine liners, sketch pens, and acrylic paints. This creative recycling celebrated both heritage and sustainability.

36th Delhi State ITF Taekwondo Championship: We are proud to share that our school participated in **the** 36th Delhi State ITF Taekwondo Championship, held at Thyagraj Indoor Stadium, New Delhi. Our students showcased exceptional talent and brought home numerous medals in Taekwondo. Congratulations to the Silver Medalist - **Reyanshi Badha**, VI B, and the Bronze Medalist - **Priyanshi**, VI A.

Subject Enrichment Activities: In English, the overarching theme of the August syllabus was fighting disability. The students watched an inspirational video on Arunima Sinha, the first female amputee to have scaled Mount Everest. They learnt a few words in Sign Language in conjunction with the poem, 'I Speak Sign Language', and tried to do things with only one limb, in conjunction with the chapter, Fight, Manju, Fight! These activities highlighted that disability is no reason not to do work or give up on one's dreams. **In Maths**, students created paper protractors and marked various angles on them to understand the concept of angle measurement in a hands-on way. **In Science**, students learnt to take proper measurements of different types of objects using instruments such as a meter scale, an inch scale, and a thread for curved surfaces. They also learnt about how to classify objects on the basis of their solubility and miscibility.


