Special Assemblies

Heritage Week & Independence Day

A special presentation by **Grade IX** beautifully captured the spirit of patriotism and added to the celebration. A special highlight of the assembly was the **felicitation of Mr. Sumit Kumar, former IPL player**, whose inspiring presence encouraged our students to dream big and work towards their goals with dedication, discipline and determination.

On **Sanskrit Diwas**, Grade VIII-A presented a meaningful special assembly highlighting the beauty, richness and timeless contribution of Sanskrit to Indian language, literature and culture.

Grade VIII-B presented a special assembly celebrating the beautiful festival of **Raksha Bandhan**. Through engaging performances and activities, the students highlighted the bond of love, care, and protection between siblings and shared the message of togetherness, respect, and affection.

In **Mathematics**, students explored the concept of *subtraction* through a hands-on “taking away” activity using everyday objects. A visual presentation and abacus practice helped reinforce understanding, making numbers come alive in their minds.

In **English**, students focused on key foundational language skills, placing strong emphasis on building grammatically correct sentences using **"is, am, and are"** while exploring concept-building **opposite words**. Through dynamic, peer-led exercises, the children steadily grew in confidence as they moved from simple word pairing to crafting complete, meaningful sentences. To deepen their understanding, they brought opposites to life through creative role-plays and interactive flashcard matching games that kept energy levels high. Building on this momentum, the young learners enthusiastically reinforced their knowledge of body parts, demonstrative words, and adjectives by reciting and performing the action rhyme *"Here is My Nose."* These multi-sensory activities not only made grammar enjoyable, but also encouraged active speaking, listening, and expressive language skills across the entire classroom.

In their Environmental Studies (EVS) unit, **“Stay Safe and Healthy,”** students took part in an engaging, hands-on learning journey! To explore health and hygiene, the children performed interactive role-plays, demonstrated proper handwashing steps, worked together to keep their classroom clean, and created creative posters to promote cleanliness awareness. Beyond personal hygiene, they learned essential lessons about road safety and the importance of conserving water. Expanding their horizons into space, the young learners also explored extraterrestrial concepts—discovering how the Sun, Earth, and Moon interact to create day and night, alongside tracking the different phases of the Moon.

Independence Day – Heritage Week Celebration

Students embarked on an inspiring journey through history, culture, and art during their vibrant Heritage Week celebrations. On the first day, the young learners packed a creative **"Indian Cultural Suitcase"** with images of traditional foods, iconic monuments, and famous landmarks to explore the rich diversity of India. The excitement continued on day two with the **Mini Monument Show & Tell Intra-Class Competition**, where children crafted detailed miniature models of historic structures and confidently spoke about them. Day three brought out their artistic flair with a **Tricolor Freedom Dove craft**, blending creativity with lessons on peace, unity, and harmony. To cap off an unforgettable week, the students participated in the **"My Heritage, My Pride"** activity on day four, drawing and coloring their favorite landmarks before speaking a few inspiring lines to share their appreciation for their country's rich legacy.

Rakhi Making for Our Brave Soldiers

Students participated in a heartfelt Rakhi Making Activity, creating colourful Rakhi’s for our brave soldiers. Through this thoughtful gesture, students expressed their gratitude, love and respect towards the soldiers who dedicate themselves to protecting our nation. The activity beautifully highlighted the values of patriotism, kindness, gratitude and caring for others.

The **Har Ghar Tiranga** campaign is an initiative that encourages citizens to proudly hoist the National Flag at their homes and participate in activities that promote patriotism and respect for the nation. As part of the

CBSE activity, students participated enthusiastically in various activities related to the National Flag and the spirit of national unity. Students were made aware of the significance of the **Tiranga**, the meaning of its three colours, and the importance of respecting the National Flag. They participated in activities such as flag-making, poster-making, drawing, slogan writing, and discussions on patriotism and national pride. The activity provided students with an opportunity to express their love for the country creatively. It also helped them understand the values of **unity, integrity, responsibility, and respect for national symbols**.

As part of the **Swachh Evam Harit Vidyalaya Rating 2026–27** programme, the school conducted various activities to promote **cleanliness, hygiene, sanitation, and healthy personal habits** among students. The activities focused on creating awareness and encouraging students to adopt good hygiene practices in their daily lives. A **handwashing activity** was conducted to educate students about the importance of washing hands regularly with soap and following the correct handwashing technique. Students were encouraged to practice proper hand hygiene, especially before eating and after using the toilet. Students were sensitized about the proper use and cleanliness of toilet facilities and were encouraged to maintain hygiene and cleanliness in and around the toilets. In addition, students were **sensitized about dental hygiene and personal hygiene**. They were guided on the importance of regular brushing, maintaining oral cleanliness, taking care of their personal appearance, wearing clean clothes, keeping their surroundings clean, and following healthy daily hygiene routines. These activities helped students understand the importance of **personal cleanliness, good hygiene habits, sanitation, and overall well-being**. Through active participation and awareness-building, the school continues to contribute towards the objectives of **SHVR 2026–27** and foster a **clean, healthy, hygienic, and responsible school community**.

Preparedness is the first step towards responding effectively in an emergency. Keeping this in focus, Imperial Heritage School organised a comprehensive **Disaster Risk Management Training and Mock Evacuation Drill** for its Floor In-Charges, teachers and Student Council Members. The Emergency Evacuation Team participated in realistic demonstrations and practical exercises covering fire emergencies, safe evacuation, first aid and casualty handling. Guided by professionals from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the training provided participants with an opportunity to practise essential response protocols and understand their roles during an emergency. More than just a drill, the initiative was a valuable lesson in **alertness, teamwork, responsibility and composure**, strengthening our collective ability to protect and support one another when it matters most.

Through hands-on and activity-based experiences, students had opportunities to explore, collaborate, create and learn in an enjoyable environment. 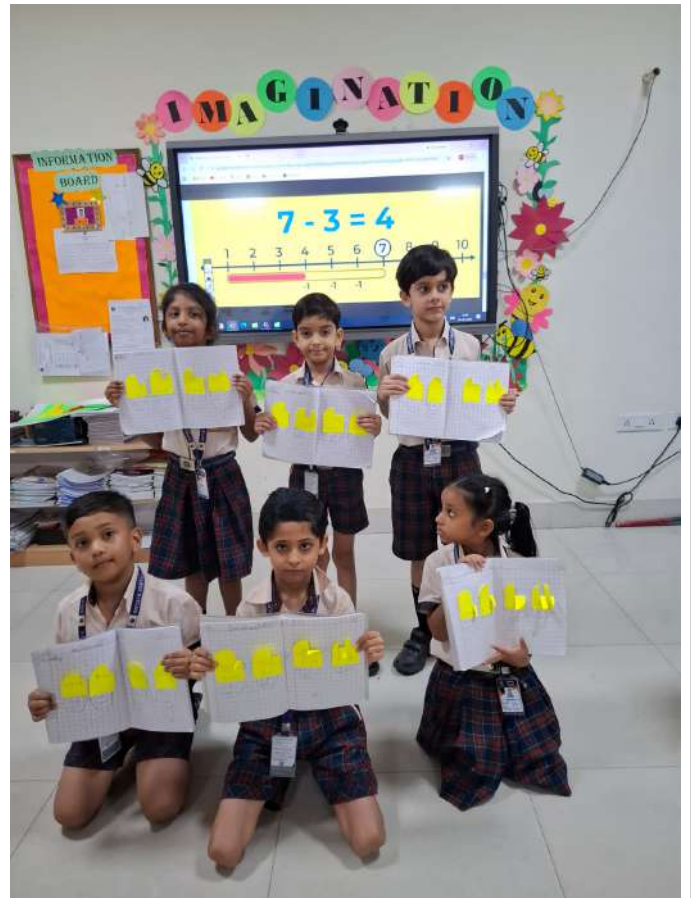
Looking Ahead to September

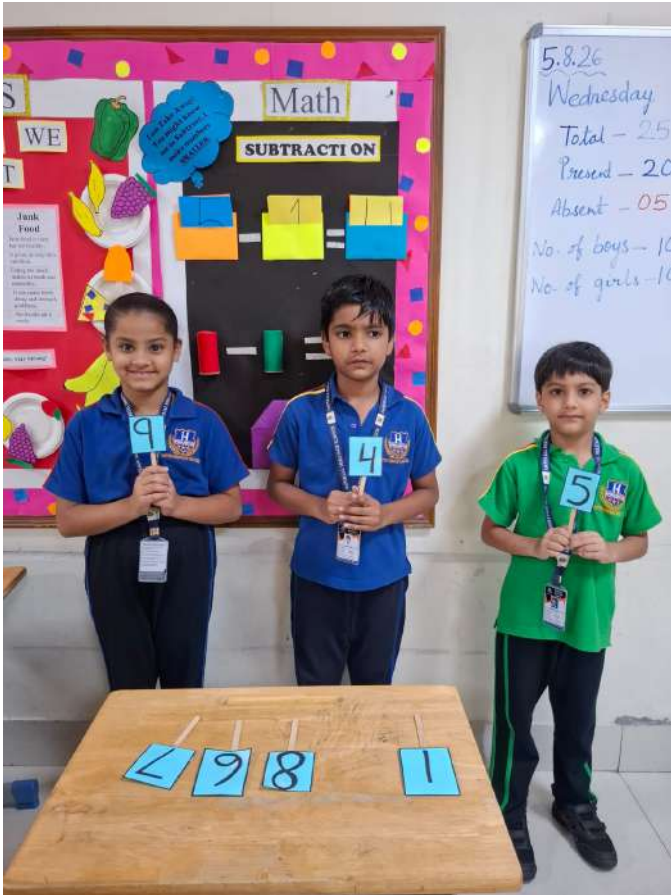

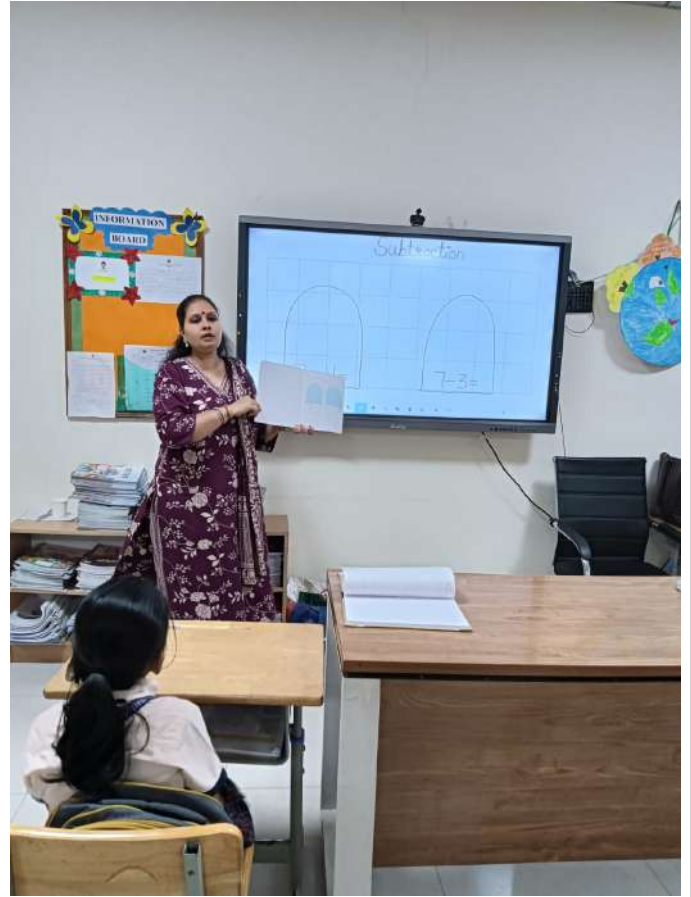
