कक्षा दशमी के विद्यार्थियों ने **संस्कृत दिवस** के अवसर पर “एक भारत, श्रेष्ठ भारत” विषय पर उत्साहपूर्वक गतिविधि में भाग लिया। विद्यार्थियों ने भारत के विभिन्न राज्यों की संस्कृति, वेशभूषा, खान-पान, लोककला, नृत्य, त्योहारों एवं प्रमुख पर्यटन स्थलों के बारे में जानकारी एकत्र की।

Disaster Risk Management Training & Mock Evacuation Drill- Imperial Heritage School conducted a Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Training and Mock Evacuation Drill for Floor In-Charges, teachers, and Student Council Members, who together form the school’s Emergency Evacuation Team. Led by experts from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the session focused on evacuation procedures, fire safety, first aid, and casualty management through practical demonstrations and hands-on training. The initiative equipped participants with essential skills and confidence to respond calmly, swiftly, and responsibly during emergencies, reinforcing the school’s commitment to building a prepared, resilient, and safety-conscious community.

SEA - Social Studies: The students of Grade X enthusiastically participated in a Working Model Making Activity based on the Geography chapter “Water Resources.” The girls’ team presented a working model on Drip Irrigation, while the boys’ team demonstrated Rainwater Harvesting, highlighting the importance of water conservation. Both groups also delivered an informative PowerPoint presentation, explaining the concepts, significance, and practical applications of their models. The activity was integrated with the Political Science chapter “Gender, Religion and Caste.” Through their outstanding presentations, students proved that no gender is less capable, as both teams displayed equal enthusiasm, creativity, confidence, and teamwork. The activity strengthened students’ understanding of sustainable water management while promoting the values of gender equality, collaboration, and experiential learning.

SEA - Mathematics: Trigonometry has always been a fascinating yet challenging topic for students. To help them understand its fundamental concepts in a simple and engaging manner, a subject enrichment activity on **Trigonometry** was conducted. During the activity, students constructed triangles and calculated the trigonometric ratios for a given fixed angle. Through hands-on exploration and comparison, they discovered an important property of trigonometric ratios—that **the values of T-ratios remain the same for a fixed angle, irrespective of the lengths of the sides of a triangle**. The activity enabled students to connect the theoretical concept with practical observation, making the learning experience more meaningful, interactive and enjoyable.

The **Value of the Month for August was *Pride***. August is a month of pride for every Indian as we celebrate the spirit of our nation and its rich heritage. An open discussion was conducted in the class, where children enthusiastically expressed what they were proud of about themselves, their families, and their country. The activity encouraged the children to reflect on their values, appreciate their identity, and understand the importance of contributing positively towards the growth of the nation.
