Imperial Heritage School hosted the EDU TV – Destination Germany programme on 18 August 2026 for the students of Grades XI and XII. The session was organised to familiarise students with the diverse opportunities available for higher education and career development in Germany.

The programme was highly informative and enriching, offering students valuable insights into higher education, university options, career pathways, academic guidance, and global opportunities in Germany. The interaction also helped students understand the scope of pursuing undergraduate and higher studies in German universities and the possibilities available to them in an increasingly global academic environment.

The session encouraged students to explore international educational opportunities with greater awareness and confidence. The expert interaction provided them with a broader perspective on making informed choices regarding their future academic and career aspirations.

Overall, the EDU TV – Destination Germany programme was an insightful and meaningful experience for the students. It successfully broadened their horizons and inspired them to explore global opportunities while planning their future academic journeys.

A **PTM** was conducted on 1 August to discuss the performance of UT2. The interaction with parents focused on identifying areas of improvement and understanding each child's learning needs. Parents were guided on providing regular support, motivation, and a conducive study environment at home.

The "**Har Ghar Tiranga**" activity is an initiative launched by the Government of India as part of the "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" to celebrate India's 80th year of independence. Students were encouraged to hoist the national flag, the Tiranga, at their homes as a sign of patriotism and pride.

Disaster Risk Management Training & Mock Evacuation Drill- Imperial Heritage School conducted a Disaster Risk Management (DRM) Training and Mock Evacuation Drill for Floor In-Charges, teachers, and Student Council Members, who together form the school's Emergency Evacuation Team. Led by experts from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the session focused on evacuation procedures, fire safety, first aid, and casualty management through practical demonstrations and hands-on training. The initiative equipped participants with essential skills and confidence to respond calmly, swiftly, and responsibly during emergencies, reinforcing the school's commitment to building a prepared, resilient, and safety-conscious community.

The value of the month was "**Pride**". The Value of the Month, **Pride**, was reinforced through a video on the correct way to fold and respectfully dispose of the National Flag. The activity helped students understand the importance of respecting the National Flag and demonstrated responsible and dignified practices towards national symbols.

CBSE has clearly outlined the significance of speaking and listening skills as part of the co-scholastic areas of achievement for every learner. **Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills** was conducted as a part of their subject enrichment activity to assess their proficiency level in the language, with the objective that they are able to interpret what is being said and are able to express themselves well.

In Political Science, students participated in an engaging activity to understand the concept of **constitutional amendments**. They were asked to create a **Rule Book** for their class, containing rules related to discipline, classroom responsibilities, participation, and conduct. After framing the initial rules, students were given situations where certain rules needed to be amended, added, or modified according to changing needs. Through this activity, students understood how amendments help a constitution remain relevant and adaptable to changing circumstances.

In Sociology, students participated in a **collage-making activity** to understand the concepts of **material and non-material culture**. They collected and creatively arranged pictures representing objects, traditions, values, beliefs, customs, language, and symbols. The activity helped students clearly differentiate between material and non-material aspects of culture and understand their significance in society.

Students during their History class explored **Theme 5: Changing Cultural Traditions** through the fascinating world of **Renaissance art**. They learned how artists moved towards realism, portraying people, nature, and everyday life with greater detail and accuracy. As a creative learning activity, students sketched their own examples of realistic art, bringing the concepts of the Renaissance to life through their artwork. It was an engaging and enjoyable way to connect historical ideas with creativity.

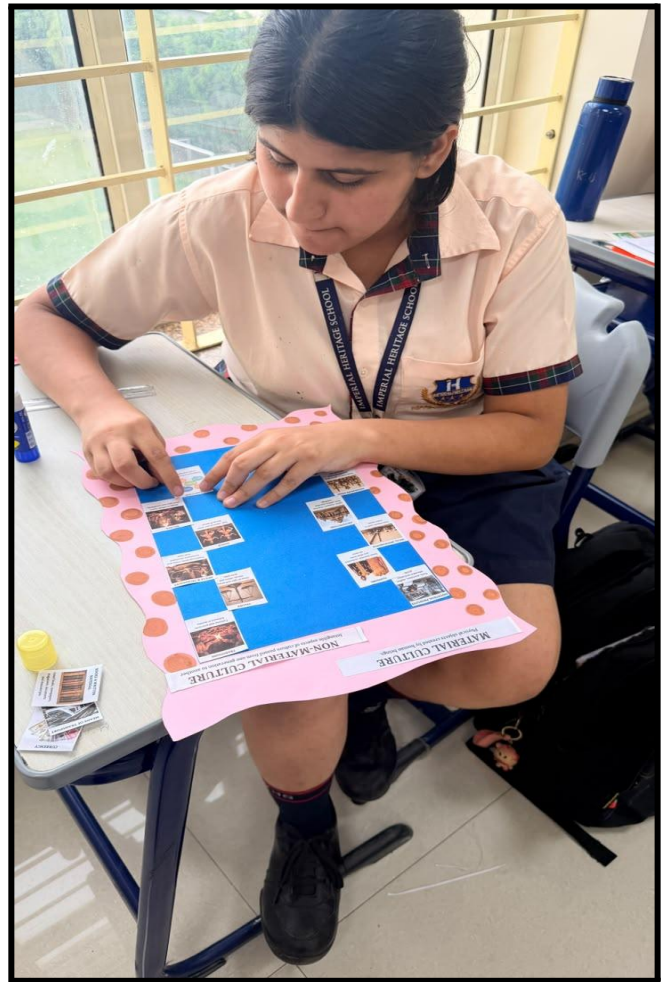

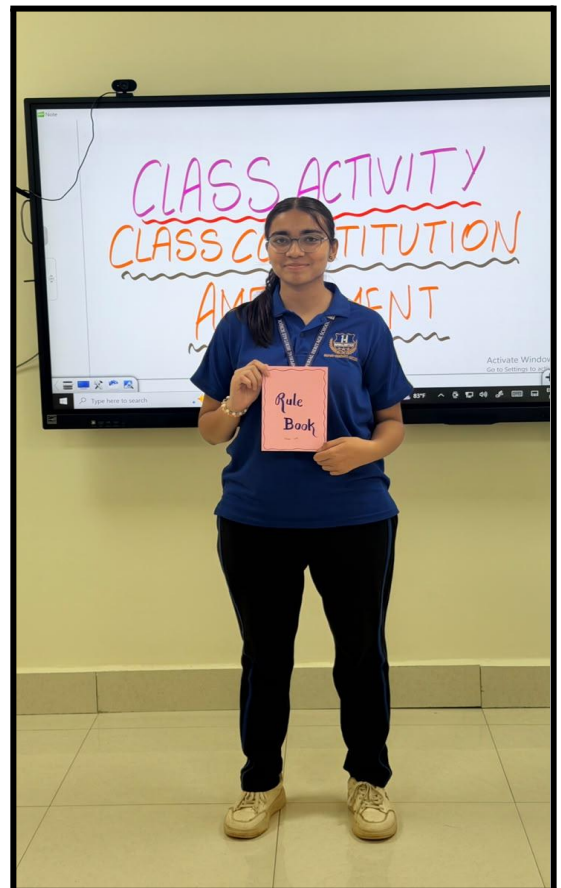
