Academics

Mathematics- Students explored multiplication through fun-filled and engaging activities that helped them understand the concept in a meaningful way. Through a Repeated Addition Activity, students sorted apples into groups and connected repeated addition with multiplication, making the concept easier to understand and remember. They further strengthened their understanding through a Multiplication Array Activity, where students represented multiplication facts using rows and columns. These hands-on experiences helped students develop conceptual clarity while making learning interactive and enjoyable.

EVS- Students learned about “My Country” and explored India’s national symbols through a creative National Symbols Collage Activity. They identified and represented important national symbols, developing a sense of pride and respect for their country. As part of their learning about houses and clothing, students created beautiful houses using different shapes in their notebooks. Through this activity, they understood why houses and clothing are important to us and how they meet our basic needs.

English- Article Gift Box Activity

Students reinforced their understanding of articles – A, An and The through a colourful and engaging Article Gift Box Activity. They drew three gift boxes and labelled them A, An and The, then wrote or drew three suitable nouns inside each box. The **Har Ghar Tiranga** campaign is an initiative that encourages citizens to proudly hoist the National Flag at their homes and participate in activities that promote patriotism and respect for the nation. As part of the CBSE activity, students participated enthusiastically in various activities related to the National Flag and the spirit of national unity. Students were made aware of the significance of the **Tiranga**, the meaning of its three colours, and the importance of respecting the National Flag. They participated in activities such as flag-making, poster-making, drawing, slogan writing, and discussions on patriotism and national pride. The activity provided students with an opportunity to express their love for the country creatively. Guided by professionals from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the training provided participants with an opportunity to practise essential response protocols and understand their roles during an emergency. More than just a

drill, the initiative was a valuable lesson in **alertness, teamwork, responsibility and composure**, strengthening our collective ability to protect and support one another when it matters most.

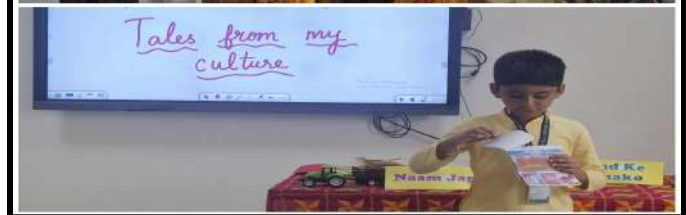

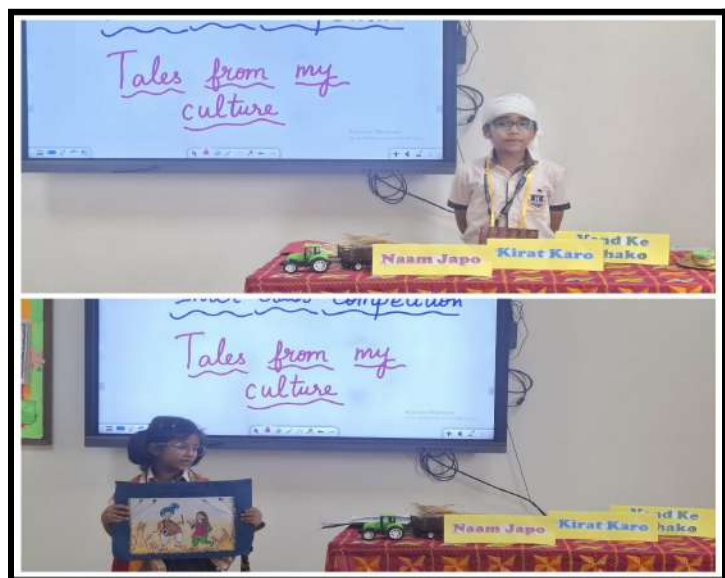

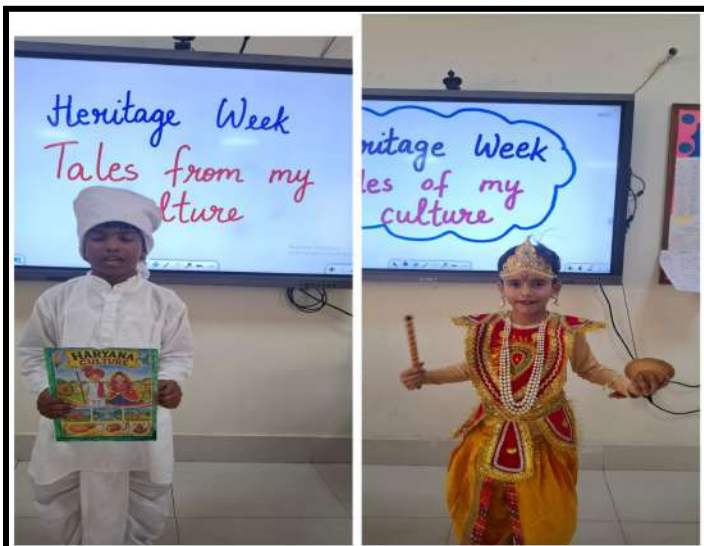

3. General Information
