Along with participating in various activities, students also immersed themselves in engaging subject enrichment activities that brought their lessons to life.

Preparedness is the first step towards responding effectively in an emergency. Keeping this in focus, Imperial Heritage School organised a comprehensive **Disaster Risk Management Training and Mock Evacuation Drill** for its Floor In-Charges, teachers and Student Council Members. The Emergency Evacuation Team participated in realistic demonstrations and practical exercises covering fire emergencies, safe evacuation, first aid and casualty handling. Guided by professionals from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the training provided participants with an opportunity to practise essential response protocols and understand their roles during an emergency. More than just a drill, the initiative was a valuable lesson in **alertness, teamwork, responsibility and composure**, strengthening our collective ability to protect and support one another when it matters most.

Under the **Heritage Week**, students came dressed as characters from **Indian folktales**, legends, and folklore, such as Tenali Rama, Birbal, Akbar, Panchatantra characters, Vikram and Betal, and other regional folk heroes. They carried simple props, wherever required, and presented a short introduction of 4–5 lines about their chosen character, highlighting its significance and the values it taught. The activity helped students connect with India's rich storytelling traditions while enhancing their confidence, communication skills, communication skills, and appreciation for India's rich cultural heritage and storytelling traditions.

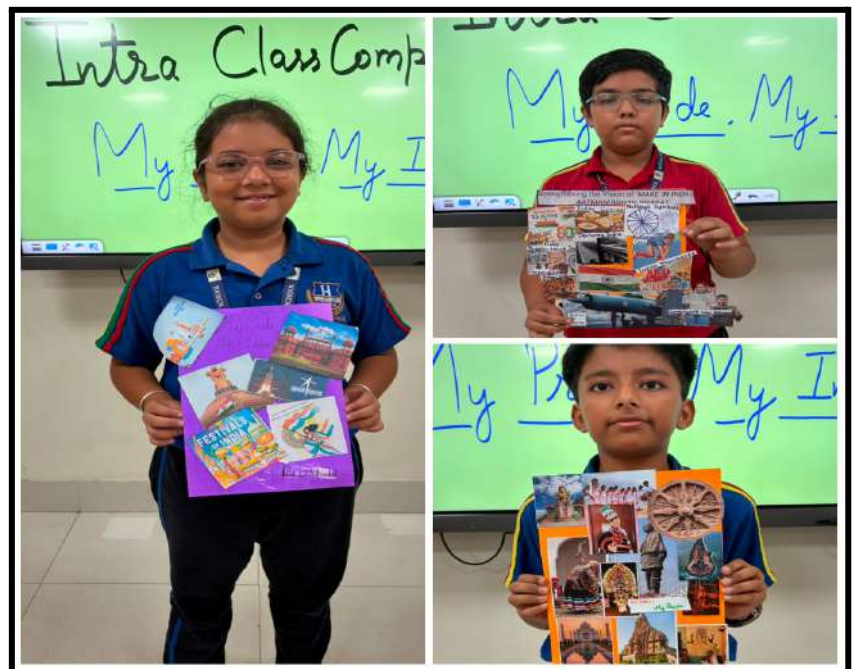
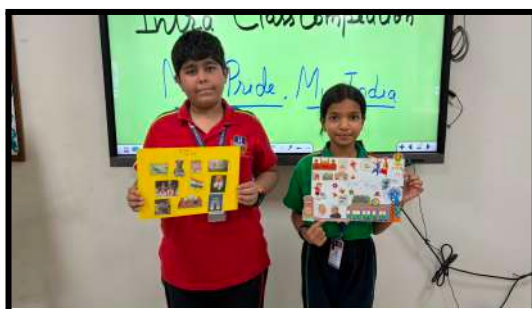

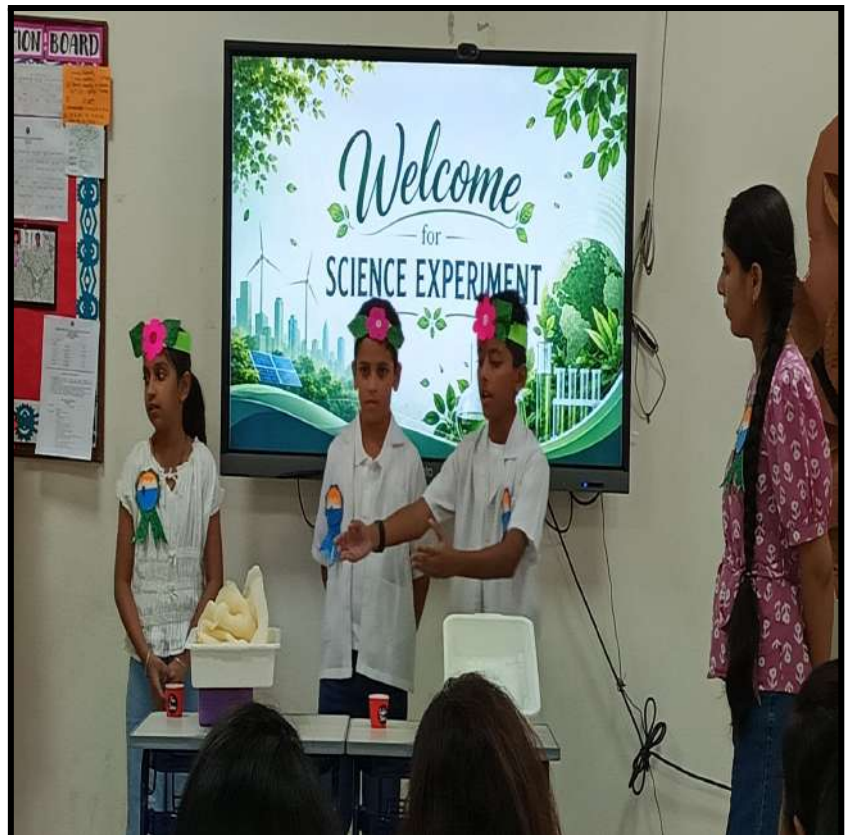

3. General Information
