Led by experts from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the session focused on evacuation procedures, fire safety, first aid, and casualty management through practical demonstrations and hands-on training. The initiative equipped participants with essential skills and confidence to respond calmly, swiftly, and responsibly during emergencies, reinforcing the school's commitment to building a prepared, resilient, and safety-conscious community.

Model United Nations : Students of Grades VII and VIII of Imperial Heritage School participated in a two-day Model United Nations (MUN) Conference held at Blue Bells Public School. The conference provided an enriching platform to develop an understanding of diplomacy, international issues, negotiation, and public speaking. **Kunal Singh of Grade VII, representing India as a delegate in the UNSC, received a Special Mention** for his commendable performance. The conference was a valuable learning experience, enhancing students' confidence, communication skills, and understanding of diplomacy.

Subject Enrichment Activities: In Science, students performed an activity, they learnt that lime water turns milky in the presence of carbon dioxide. This was observed when they blew exhaled air, which contains carbon dioxide, into the lime water. In another activity, they observed that magnesium metal burns with a dazzling white flame and produces magnesium oxide, which is basic in nature. They confirmed this by testing it with an acid-base indicator.

Value of the Month – Pride

The value of **Pride** was nurtured through classroom activities that encouraged students to recognise their achievements, appreciate their strengths, and take pride in their efforts and responsibilities. Through discussions and reflective activities, students explored the difference between **healthy pride and arrogance** and learnt to value the achievements of others.
