In keeping with the spirit of “Give Away”, our students participated with a generous heart, celebrating the achievements of fellow participants and making the event a true celebration of sportsmanship, collaboration and collective success.

MAADHYAM 2026 – AETHERON was a huge success and a memorable experience, reaffirming our belief that when we give others the opportunity to shine, we shine even brighter together.

In **academics**, students explored the letters N, V, W, and X, learned numbers 4 and 5, and discovered the shape of a square through a variety of fun and interactive activities. They practiced tracing and writing letters, played games to strengthen recognition skills, and counted objects to understand numbers. The

concept of a square came alive through drawing and craft activities, making learning hands-on and enjoyable. Students also practiced writing the letters L, T, H, I, E, and F in their notebooks to reinforce their skills.

Heritage Week & Independence Day

A special presentation by **Grade IX** beautifully captured the spirit of patriotism and added to the celebration. A special highlight of the assembly was the **felicitation of Mr. Sumit Kumar, former IPL player**, whose inspiring presence encouraged our students to dream big and work towards their goals with dedication, discipline and determination.

Heritage Footsteps Murals

Students participated in the “Heritage Footsteps Murals” activity and explored India’s rich cultural heritage. They expressed their understanding of Indian culture, traditions, food and festivals through creative foot-shaped murals. The activity encouraged creativity and helped students develop a deeper appreciation and pride in India’s diverse heritage.

On **Sanskrit Diwas** Grade VIII-A presented a meaningful special assembly highlighting the beauty, richness and timeless contribution of Sanskrit to Indian language, literature and culture.

Grade VIII-B presented a special assembly celebrating the beautiful festival of **Raksha Bandhan**. Through engaging performances and activities, the students highlighted the bond of love, care, and protection between siblings and shared the message of togetherness, respect, and affection.

As part of the **Swachh Exam Harita Vidyalaya Rating 2026–27 programme**, the school conducted various activities to promote cleanliness, hygiene, sanitation, and healthy personal habits among students. The activities focused on creating awareness and encouraging students to adopt good hygiene practices in their daily lives. A handwashing activity was conducted to educate students about the importance of washing hands regularly with soap and following the correct handwashing technique. Students were encouraged to practice proper hand hygiene, especially before eating and after using the toilet. Students were sensitized about the proper use and cleanliness of toilet facilities and were encouraged to maintain hygiene and cleanliness in and around the toilets. In addition, students were sensitized about dental hygiene and personal hygiene. They were guided on the importance of regular brushing, maintaining oral cleanliness, taking care of their personal appearance, wearing clean clothes, keeping their surroundings clean, and following healthy daily hygiene routines. These activities helped students understand the importance of personal cleanliness, good hygiene habits, sanitation, and overall well-being. Through active participation and awareness-building, the school continues to contribute towards the objectives of SHVR 2026–27 and foster a clean, healthy, hygienic, and responsible school community.

Preparedness is the first step towards responding effectively in an emergency. Keeping this in focus, Imperial Heritage School organised a comprehensive **Disaster Risk Management Training and Mock Evacuation Drill** for its Floor In-Charges, teachers and Student Council Members. The Emergency Evacuation Team participated in realistic demonstrations and practical exercises covering fire emergencies, safe evacuation, first aid and casualty handling. Guided by professionals from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the training provided participants with an opportunity to practise essential response protocols and understand their roles during an emergency. More than just a drill, the initiative was a valuable lesson in **alertness, teamwork, responsibility and composure**, strengthening our collective ability to protect and support one another when it matters most.

The **value of the month** was pride, and our students brought it to life by learning the patriotic song ‘Sare Jahan Se Achha’ and performing an energetic dance to ‘Nanha Munna Rahi Hoon.’ Through these musical and rhythmic activities, they not only had fun but also developed a heartfelt sense of respect, love, and pride for their country.

During the **Colour Burst** celebration, students enthusiastically expressed their patriotism by wearing vibrant tricolour outfits, radiating pride and joy. They also created beautiful tricolour kites by tapping saffron, white, and green paint with their tiny hands, turning the activity into a joyful and memorable hands-on experience. The celebration encouraged creativity, fine motor development, and a sense of love and pride for our nation.

Raksha Bandhan is a beautiful celebration of the special bond of love, care, and affection between siblings. Our little learners joyfully participated in a creative hands-on activity and made beautiful handmade rakhis using colourful paper cut-outs and pasting. Through this activity, they explored their creativity while understanding the significance of the festival and the precious bond shared between brothers and sisters. The little ones enjoyed creating their colourful rakhis and celebrated the spirit of Raksha Bandhan with great enthusiasm.

As part of the **EVS theme Food**, our little ones explored the difference between healthy and junk food through fun, engaging, and interactive activities. They learnt about the benefits of nutritious foods and the importance of making healthy food choices. With the help of a colourful display board, the children also learnt about different types of food—what we can eat regularly, occasionally, and what we should avoid. They also explored different kinds of beverages and understood the importance of choosing healthy drinks. These activities helped make the concept of healthy eating simple, meaningful, and enjoyable for our young learners.

During **Bagless Day** the children enthusiastically participated in a variety of fun and hands-on learning activities. They practised tracing letters N, V, X and W using water and earbuds on a blackboard, making learning enjoyable and engaging. In the numeracy activity, they checked the number written on a plate and created a corresponding track using paper cups, strengthening their number recognition and counting skills. They also sorted pictures of healthy and junk food and pasted them under the thumbs-up and thumbs-down signs, helping them understand healthy food choices through an interactive experience. The day was filled with joyful learning, creativity and active participation.
