Greetings!**

As the vibrant month of August transitions into the calm and pleasant days of September, it is the perfect time to embrace the changing weather and enjoy a slower pace before the festive season begins. August was a month filled with academic enrichment, experiential learning, and celebrations that fostered a sense of patriotism among the students.

Imperial Heritage School successfully hosted the 6th edition of MAADHYAM 2026 – AETHERON: The Future Minds Arena, a grand inter-school extravaganza celebrating innovation, creativity, technology and the limitless potential of young minds.

The event witnessed an overwhelming participation of 30+ schools and 500+ students, creating an energetic and inspiring atmosphere filled with creativity, talent and futuristic ideas. With a wide array of events and competitions, AETHERON provided students with a platform to explore, innovate, collaborate and showcase their unique abilities.

Our students participated enthusiastically in all the events, delivering extraordinary performances and leaving a lasting impression with their confidence, creativity and talent. While we did not compete for prizes, our participation reflected a deeper philosophy — we believe that true success lies not only in winning, but also in giving, sharing and creating opportunities for others to shine.

In keeping with the spirit of “Give Away”, our students participated with a generous heart, celebrating the achievements of fellow participants and making the event a true celebration of sportsmanship, collaboration and collective success.

MAADHYAM 2026 – AETHERON was a huge success and a memorable experience, reaffirming our belief that when we give others the opportunity to shine, we shine even brighter together.

On the **academic front**, students revised cursive writing from **a to z**, explored vowels (**a, e, i, o, u**) and consonants, and practiced vowel ‘a’ cluster words such as **at and ab**. Their vocabulary was further enriched through the introduction of sight words. In Mathematics, children were introduced to **sorting and grouping** and

developed an understanding of **tens and ones up to 90**. They also reinforced concepts such as **missing numbers, before, after, and between** through engaging and hands-on activities. Under the theme '**Food**', students explored the importance of healthy eating, junk food, balanced diets, nutrition, and the role of food in our lives. A range of interactive activities made the learning meaningful and enjoyable. These included **Salad Day, food hygiene activities, healthy and junk food sorting games**, and presentations highlighting the importance of food during different festivals and celebrations.

Pride was the value for the month, and it was wonderful to see our students understand and embrace this value through engaging activities. Stories about inspiring national heroes and India's rich heritage were narrated, along with national songs that helped children connect with the spirit of patriotism and develop a sense of pride in their country. These meaningful experiences made the value of pride more relatable and memorable, while encouraging children to appreciate their nation, its symbols, and its rich cultural heritage.

Heritage Week was a joyful and enriching experience for our UKG learners, giving them an opportunity to explore and appreciate India's rich culture, traditions, and heritage. On **Day 1**, children were introduced to the concept of heritage through interactive discussions and short videos, followed by a creative **Mandala Art** activity that encouraged concentration, creativity, and fine-motor skills. On **Day 2**, they enthusiastically participated in a fun **Heritage Quiz**, exploring questions about Indian states, national heroes, monuments, national symbols, the national flag, festivals, and other aspects of our cultural heritage. On **Day 3**, the spirit of patriotism came alive as the children came dressed in **tricolour outfits** and participated in a creative **Tricolour Palette** activity. Using earbuds, poster colours, and paper plates, they created the saffron, white, and green shades and placed the Ashoka Chakra at the centre. Through these engaging experiences, the children learned about their country's heritage while celebrating the values of **creativity, cultural pride, and patriotism**.

A special presentation by **Grade IX** beautifully captured the spirit of patriotism and added to the celebration. A special highlight of the assembly was the **felicitation of Mr. Sumit Kumar, former IPL player**, whose inspiring presence encouraged our students to dream big and work towards their goals with dedication, discipline and determination.

On **Sanskrit Diwas**, Grade VIII-A presented a meaningful special assembly highlighting the beauty, richness and timeless contribution of Sanskrit to Indian language, literature and culture.

CBSE Activities

The **Har Ghar Tiranga** campaign is an initiative that encourages citizens to proudly hoist the National Flag at their homes and participate in activities that promote patriotism and respect for the nation. As part of the CBSE activity, students participated enthusiastically in various activities related to the National Flag and the spirit of national unity. Students were made aware of the significance of the **Tiranga**, the meaning of its three colours, and the importance of respecting the National Flag. They participated in activities such as flag-making, poster-making, drawing, slogan writing, and discussions on patriotism and national pride. The activity provided students with an opportunity to express their love for the country creatively. It also helped them understand the values of **unity, integrity, responsibility, and respect for national symbols**.

As part of the **Swatchh Evam Harit Vidyalaya Rating 2026–27** programme, the school conducted various activities to promote **cleanliness, hygiene, sanitation, and healthy personal habits** among students. The activities focused on creating awareness and encouraging students to adopt good hygiene practices in their daily lives. A **handwashing activity** was conducted to educate students about the importance of washing hands regularly with soap and following the correct handwashing technique. Students were encouraged to practice proper hand hygiene, especially before eating and after using the toilet. Students were sensitized about the proper use and **dental hygiene and personal hygiene**. They were guided on the importance of regular brushing, maintaining oral cleanliness, taking care of their personal cleanliness of toilet facilities and were encouraged to maintain hygiene and cleanliness in and around the toilets. In addition, students

were **sensitized about** appearance, wearing clean clothes, keeping their surroundings clean, and following healthy daily hygiene routines. These activities helped students understand the importance of **personal cleanliness, good hygiene habits, sanitation, and overall well-being**. Through active participation and awareness-building, the school continues to contribute towards the objectives of **SHVR 2026–27** and foster a **clean, healthy, hygienic, and responsible school community**.

Preparedness is the first step towards responding effectively in an emergency. Keeping this in focus, Imperial Heritage School organised a comprehensive **Disaster Risk Management Training and Mock Evacuation Drill** for its Floor In-Charges, teachers and Student Council Members. The Emergency Evacuation Team participated in realistic demonstrations and practical exercises covering fire emergencies, safe evacuation, first aid and casualty handling. Guided by professionals from Zone 4 Disaster Solutions Pvt. Ltd., the training provided participants with an opportunity to practise essential response protocols and understand their roles during an emergency. More than just a drill, the initiative was a valuable lesson in **alertness, teamwork, responsibility and composure**, strengthening our collective ability to protect and support one another when it matters most.

Raksha Bandhan Celebrations- Children enthusiastically participated in a Rakhi Craft Activity, celebrating the beautiful bond of love, care, and togetherness. They created colourful rakhis by carefully pasting decorative strips and adding vibrant beads to make their designs unique. The activity encouraged creativity, fine-motor skills, and careful hand-eye coordination. As they proudly displayed their handmade rakhis, children also shared their thoughts about the special bonds they share with their siblings and loved ones.

Grade VIII-B presented a special assembly celebrating the beautiful festival of **Raksha Bandhan**. Through engaging performances and activities, the students highlighted the bond of love, care, and protection between siblings and shared the message of togetherness, respect, and affection.

Theme Activity: Tiny Hands, Tasty Creations!

The children participated in a fun and engaging **Flameless Cooking Activity – No-Bake Oreo Cake**, where they enjoyed crushing the biscuits, measuring and mixing the ingredients, and learning their names. They were introduced to simple culinary terms such as **mix, crush, measure, pour, and decorate** while exploring different textures and ingredients. The activity also encouraged them to follow instructions, take turns, work together, and develop their fine-motor and language skills. Overall, it was a delightful hands-on experience that combined learning, creativity, and teamwork.

Bagless Day was celebrated with a joyful blend of fun, learning, and creativity. As part of their portfolio work, the children enthusiastically participated in the **Caterpillar Consonant and Vowel Activity**, where they explored and identified vowels and consonants in an engaging and hands-on way. Looking Ahead to September

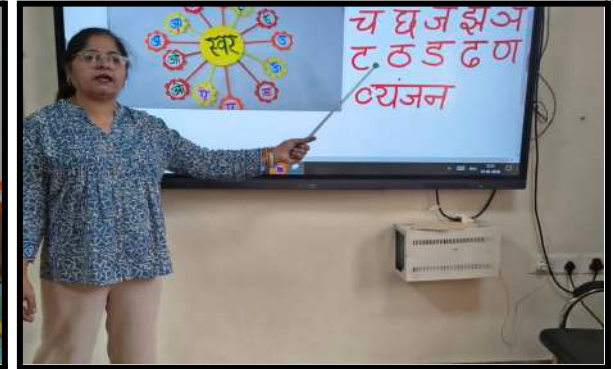

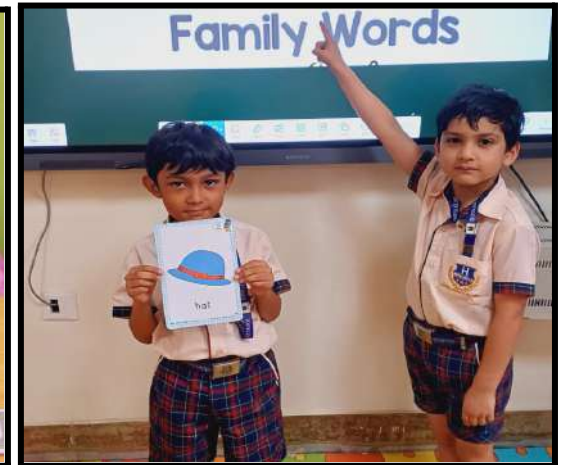
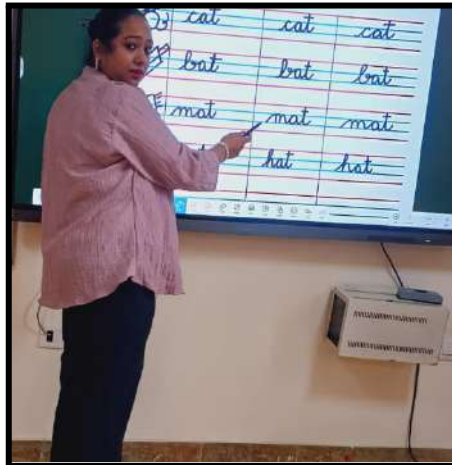
