In **Biology** students practically learned the structural features of stomata by making a temporary slide. In **Physics** refraction through a glass prism was conducted to understand the refraction phenomenon practically. In **Chemistry** students studied the properties of acetic acid - Odour, solubility in water, effect on litmus, reaction with Sodium Hydrogen Carbonate, and the comparative cleaning capacity of a sample of soap in soft and hard water.

In Economics, the students had to observe all kinds of activities happening around their locality and classify them into Economic and Non- economic activities.

Write a Blog: An activity in **English** was done with reference to the chapter Glimpses of India, wherein the students had written a blog online that mentioned the ancient culture and traditions of mesmerizing destinations like Goa, Coorg, and Assam.

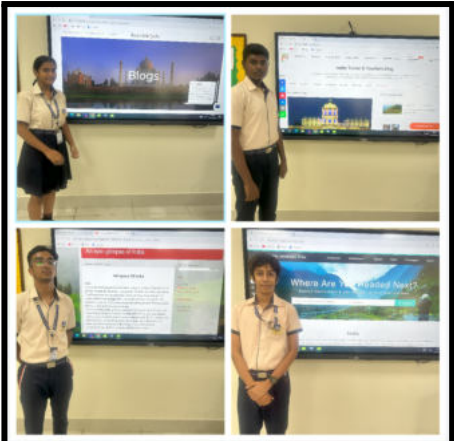
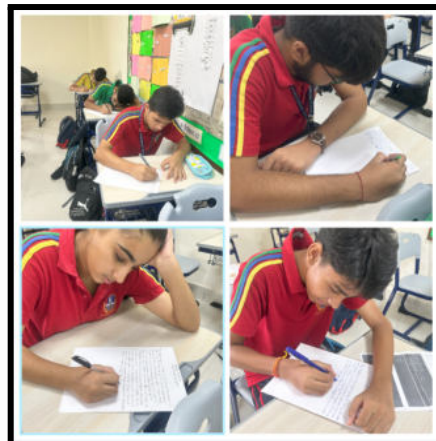
