This month has been planned for activities, competitions, and accomplishing the planned syllabus for Term I Examination. The month of August resonated with patriotism and freedom as the country completed 76 years of freedom. Students commemorated the birth of a free nation after the relentless efforts of freedom fighters and revolutionaries against oppressive British rule.

Students of Grade XI presented a ‘**Special Assembly**’ on Independence Day, showcasing Mahatma Gandhi’s ideology of non-violence through a skit. They also presented a soul-stirring medley of patriotic songs, followed by a foot tapping dance.

Imperial Heritage School hosted the 3rd Annual Inter School Event, **Maadhyam- Over the Ages**. With over 25 schools participating in eight events, the school was palpating with energy and enthusiasm. The theme Over the Ages gave the students an opportunity to explore the past and present and also understand what the future would be like.

As a part of CBSE activities, our students took part in ‘**Har Ghar Tiranga**’ campaign, under the aegis of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav to encourage them to bring the Tiranga home and to hoist it to mark the glory of India’s independence.

The 2nd **CBSE Expression Series** for the academic session 2023-24 was organized on the theme ‘**G-20: India’s Vision For A Harmonious World**’ wherein the students wrote a poem on ‘India’s Road Map to Renewable Energy’.

In commemoration of the 3rd Anniversary of NEP-2020, a **CBSE activity, - One Child, One Plant**, was conducted in the school premises, wherein the students planted saplings with a lot of zeal.

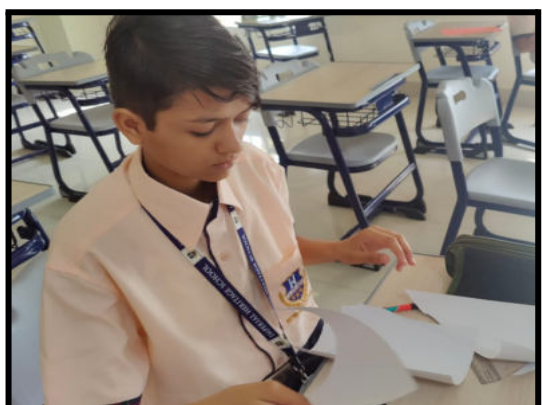
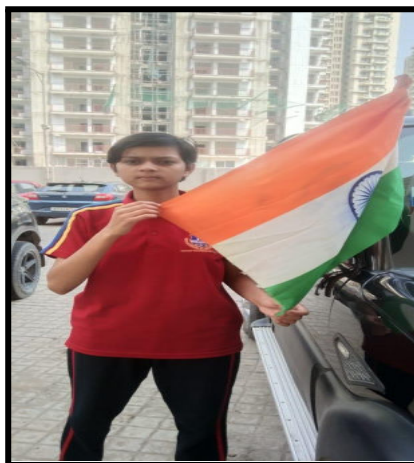
The ‘**Investiture Ceremony**’ signifies the reliance and confidence that the school consigns in the newly invested office bearers. Donning the mantle of accountability, students pledged to bestow their duties to the best of their abilities. Team IHS believes that delegation of responsibility and giving authority to children is important as it teaches them the lifelong skills of being powerful and caring at the same time.

Our past helps us learn and move ahead with caution. Learning the same, the students were explained the significance of ‘**Hiroshima Day**’ as it aims to promote peace politics against the war. This day is a reminder of the bombing attack on Hiroshima by the United States during World War II. Hiroshima Day serves as a day of remembrance and a focus for anti-war and anti-nuclear demonstrations in several countries. The students made a poster to raise awareness about anti-war weapons and spread the message of Universal Brotherhood and World Peace.

For Grade XI students, an **educational trip** was arranged at BML Munjal University, Gurugram. They had a session on entrepreneurship where students were asked to create an App for any product/service of their choice. The students showed full enthusiasm and presented their ideas. They were briefed about the courses offered by BML University and were shown the campus.

Values are an integral part of the curriculum at Imperial Heritage School, and a quote by C.S. Lewis, *“Education without values, as useful as it is, seems rather to make man a more clever devil,”* resonates the same. The value of the month was **Patriotism**, and students were engaged in group discussions and were shown videos on the same.

An activity in **English** was done with reference to the chapter ‘Discovering Tut: The Saga Continues’ wherein the students of Grade XI showcased the Egyptian ruler-Tutankhamun’s family line with their description through a flow chart. In **Economics**, an activity was conducted wherein the students explained about the ‘Law of Variable Proportions’ with various examples. In **Psychology**, to determine the span of attention of digits, students conducted an experiment in class. Students were able to correlate the findings of the experiment with real life and gain an understanding of why motorbikes or cars are given a number plate that has only four digit numbers. In **General Studies**, two activities were conducted wherein the students made a PPT on the topic ‘Cyber Safety’ and presented it in grades VI-X and in the second activity, they highlighted the importance of ‘Unity in Diversity’ through posters.
