**Subject-related activities:** Students were introduced to various topics in the classroom. In **English**, students formed 3 groups—Dunham, Elaine, and Mrs. Pringle—to find out their traits as read and discussed in the hilarious play, Fourteen. The groups worked together to find out the qualities of the characters in under 2 minutes. A few new words, such as gold digger, pretentious, multitasker, dominating, and timid, were also discussed and attributed to the characters. The students also made cards for themselves, on which they wrote a motivational message. The poem read and discussed in class was It can't be done.
