Traditionally considered the month that marks transitions between seasons, September is often one of the most temperate weather-wise. This month has been planned for activities, competitions, and accomplishing the planned syllabus for Term I Examination. The month of August resonated with the patriotic feeling of independence and freedom as the country completed 76 years of freedom. Students commemorated the birth of a free nation after the relentless efforts of freedom fighters and revolutionaries against oppressive British rule. The month of August was full of curricular and cocurricular activities.

Students of Grade XI presented a ‘**Special Assembly**’ to mark the 77th Independence Day, which gave an insight into our struggle for independence while also showcasing Mahatma Gandhi’s ideology of non-violence through a skit. They also presented a soul-stirring medley of patriotic songs, followed by a foot tapping dance.

Heritage Week was celebrated in the school to highlight the rich culture that India has through its diversity in many forms. As it was a week to appreciate our heritage, students of Grade IX designed a poster on the temple architecture of India, highlighting special features of the temples. An inter-house competition was organized, wherein students of Grades IX made beautiful kites highlighting the tribal festivals of India. In this competition, Champions House secured the 1st position, Warriors House secured the 2nd position, and Leaders House secured the 3rd position.

To end the week, an educational trip to **Humayun's Tomb** was organized for the students of Grade IX, which benefited the students immensely as they got well-versed with the history of the walled city, opulent red sandstone tomb of the Mughal Emperor Humayun, and the architecture of the Mughal era. The students appreciated the beauty of Mughal architecture and learned that they should conserve the national heritage. The Heritage Walk was a wonderful learning experience for the students, who returned more aware, confident, and responsible citizens of today.

Our past helps us learn and move ahead with caution. Learning the same, the students were explained the significance of ‘**Hiroshima Day**’ as it aims to promote peace politics against the war. This day is a reminder of the bombing attack on Hiroshima by the United States during World War II. Hiroshima Day serves as a day of remembrance and a focus for anti-war and anti-nuclear demonstrations in several countries. The students made a poster to raise awareness about anti-war weapons and spread the message of Universal Brotherhood and World Peace.

Imperial Heritage School hosted the 3rd Annual Interschool Event, **MAADHYAM: Over the Ages**. With over 25 schools participating in eight events, the school was palpitating with energy and enthusiasm. The theme Over the Ages gave the students an opportunity to explore the past and present and also understand what the future would be like. Students of Grade IX, Kanika Kumari, Anushka Dahiya, Navya Trehan, Ishika Saini, Gunjan, and Lavanya, participated in the event “Groove to Move,” where they presented an Indian tribal dance on western music.

The CBSE 2nd Expression Series for the academic session 2023–24 was organized on the theme ‘**G-20: India’s Vision for a Harmonious World**’. Students participated wholeheartedly as the competition encompassed a myriad of expressions, including essay writing, poem composition, and drawings.

In commemoration of the 3rd Anniversary of NEP-2020, **CBSE activity**, - **One Child, One Plant**, was conducted on the school premises, wherein the students planted saplings with a lot of zeal.

Sanskrit Diwas was also celebrated and students did various activities based on Sanskrit : the Language of the God.

In academics, students in Grade IX were engaged in different subject activities.

In **Chemistry**, students performed the following practicals:

1. Study physical and chemical changes
2. Prepare a mixture and a compound using iron filings and sulphur powder and distinguish between them.

In **Biology**, students identified and studied the characteristic features of plant permanent tissues microscopically.

In **Hindi**, students performed an activity on “Samvad,“ wherein students did “Vad-Samvad” with each other.

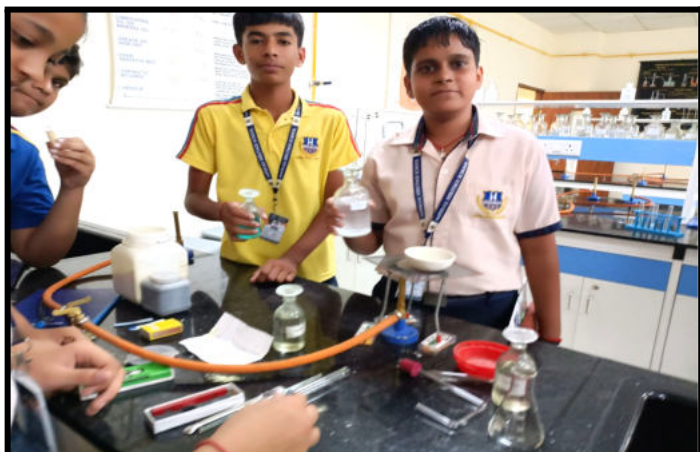
